Hellesylt **BRIKSDAL GLACIER WALK**

In a nutshell

Have you ever seen a glacier? This is exactly what we'll be doing on this tour – and not just on any glacier either: the Briksdal, a spectacular expanse of ice hidden among the magnificent Norwegian fjords.

Main stops

- Village of Hellesylt and Hellesylt waterfall
- Lake Hornindalsvanet
- Nordfjord, villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden
- Briksdal Glacier and spectacular nature
- Mountain lodge near the glacier with a stop for lunch
- Road to Stryn, return trip via Geiranger, tunnels and panoramic viewpoint at Flydal Gorge

The programme

- Our excursion begins in the **village of Hellesylt**, where we can admire the majestic **waterfall** of the same name, whose waters cascade down to the shimmering emerald green and ultramarine blue fjord below.
- We continue our journey towards **Hornindalsvanet** which, at a depth of 514 metres, can claim to be Europe's deepest lake; before us lies the magnificent **Nordfjord**, alongside the road through the villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden. This fascinating village nestles at the bottom of the fjord and stretches along numerous lakes in the Olden Valley as far as the mountain lodge at the Briksdal Glacier.
- Our walk takes us through stunning nature to the **Briksdal Glacier**, a branch of the mighty **Jostedalsglacier**, the largest in Europe.
- At first, the path climbs and crosses over the waterfall on a wooden bridge.
- At this point we find ourselves standing face to face with the massive glacier.
- We'll then walk back the same way to the mountain lodge, where we'll enjoy an **excellent lunch**.
- Back on our journey, we cross the valley alongside the extraordinarily beautiful lake towards Stryn.
- We climb the **mountain road to Stryn**, which used to link eastern Norway with the west.
- Our return journey to Geiranger runs through quite a few tunnels, and we make a final stop at **Flydal** to take a few snapshots of our ship, waiting for us in the fjord.

Geiranger **HIKING IN THE MOUNTAINS**

In a nutshell

A hiking excursion that will take in the stunning sights of Geirangerfjord with its imposing mountains, thunderous waterfalls and farms dotted across the steep slopes.

Main stops

- Geiranger Church
- Hole Camping
- Hiking in the mountains
- Storsæter waterfall
- Westerås farm
- Drink at the farm

The programme

- We will leave the dock by coach and prepare ourselves for the ride up the hill whilst we pass **Geiranger church**, an octagonal wooden building with a slate roof nestled into the rocks.
- After a number of twists and turns, we will reach **Hole Camping**. We will leave the coach there and start our excursion on foot.
- Our route will see us **zig-zagging up the mountain** and crossing summer pastures. In the past, all the straw available was used, even the straw that grew in the most inaccessible places. It was collected and sent down the valley using the *løypestreng*, a cable that stretched to the nearest barn.
- Our destination is the **spectacular Storsæter waterfall**, which gushes out from a height of 30 metres forming a large curve so we can walk right under it!
- After admiring this incredible view, we will hike down to **Westerås farm**, which lies on a projection jutting out over Geiranger.
- Uninhabited during winter and at the beginning of spring due to the danger of avalanches, it is a hive of activity during the summer months and it is here that we will be served **a drink**.
- After relaxing for a while, we will have some **free time** to look around the farm before returning on foot to Hole Camping where our coach will be waiting to take us back to the quay in Geiranger.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

NORTHERN EUROPE

- The walk to the waterfall takes around 1 hour (3 km) and covers rough ground and steep sections so it may be tiring.
- We recommend wearing walking shoes and suitable clothing.

An extraordinary helicopter experience discovering the natural wonders and beautiful landscape of Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, from a unique perspective up above. We will see its picture-postcard scenery: majestic snow-capped mountains, rugged cliffs, cascading waterfalls, and small colourful farms nestled in the lush vegetation. An unmissable tour for nature lovers and more!

Main stops

- Helicopter flight over Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site

NORTHERN EUROPE



- Breathtaking views of the surrounding snow-capped mountains
- Mount Dalsnibba, rugged cliffs, waterfalls, farms, glaciers

The programme

- We will take to the skies for this excursion on a **helicopter ride** and soar over **one of the most famous and spectacular fjords** in Norway: **Geirangerfjord**, declared a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** in 2005.
- We will cover the full length of the fjord, around 15 km, starting at sea level and rising to the summit of the **surrounding snow-capped mountains**: we will be amazed by the **breathtaking views and steep, rugged cliffs** with powerful **waterfalls** (such as the 'Seven Sisters' or 'Bridal Veil Falls'), which create light veils of mist that produce an endless display of ever-changing rainbows, which will leave us lost for words.
- We will fly to **Mount Dalsnibba**, 1500 metres high, which towers over the tourist town of Geiranger, located at the end of the fjord. We will be able to see **small farms** from up here, nestled in the foothills of the mountains, and higher up **glaciers** with ice caves and small icy waterfalls.
- As we fly back along the fjord to return to base, we will notice the lush vegetation beneath us, a fundamental part of this wild and exciting natural landscape.
- The flight lasts approximately 30 minutes.
- The flight, landing and routes may be subject to change depending on weather conditions and are at the pilot's discretion.
- The flight times are indicative and include landing.

OVERLAND: MT STRANDA AND TROLLSTIGEN (ends in Geiranger)

In a nutshell

We will explore the awe-inspiring Norwegian landscape visiting several destinations along the spectacular Geirangerfjord, taking a cable car up to the top of the famous Stranda mountain and we will cross the fjord on a boat and reach one of the steepest and most thrilling roads in the world.

Main stops

- Viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord

- Stranda mountain and spectacular cable car
- Lunch at a restaurant
- Ferry ride across the fjord
- Trollstigen (photostop)
- Ørnesvingen viewpoint and Seven Sisters waterfall
- Geiranger

The programme

- We will leave the port of Hellesylt and head north, soon making a stop at the **viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord**, where we can take photos of the breathtaking views with our cameras.
- Afterwards, we will continue to **Mount Stranda**, a renowned ski resort offering breathtaking views of the surrounding snowy peaks as well as the majestic Storfjord.
- We will leave our coach behind us and climb to the top on a **spectacular cable car** whose large windows offer us 360° views of the fjord and mountains.
- The cable car runs to 1042 metres above sea level, where we can feel in **direct contact with nature** as we see goats grazing in summer and plenty of snow for the kids to play in.
- From the top of the mountain we can enjoy **exceptional views** of the majestic Geirangerfjord, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Jostedal glacier, the largest in Europe situated on dry land.
- We will then **cross the Geirangerfjord on a ferry**, marvelling at the steep, imposing mountains with their countless waterfalls dropping down towards the sea.
- Our next destination is a photostop at the famous **Trollstigen** or 'Trolls' Path', an engineering feat consisting of an extremely narrow scenic road with 11 hairpin bends and a hair-raising steep gradient, surrounded by majestic mountains and stunning waterfalls.
- Back down at the fjord, we will take the ferry back across it and stop at the **Ørnesvingen viewpoint**, which literally means Eagles' Turn, where we can admire and take photos of the Geirangerfjord and the **Seven Sisters waterfall**, so called because it splits into seven rivulets over the rock face.
- Then we will travel along the last section of the road and stop in **Geiranger**, our final destination.
- The excursion starts in Hellesylt and ends in Geiranger.
- For safety reasons, if Trollstigen road is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.

In a nutshell

From **viewpoints that feel like they're touching the sky**, capture all the beauty of the **Geiranger Fjord**. You'll reach them **by bus with your guide**, as you make your way up **winding roads** to the top of **mount Dalsnibba**. Among the mountains, glaciers, waterfalls and villages, keep your eyes peeled and your camera at the ready, so you don't miss out on a single glimpse of this **UNESCO world heritage site**.

Main stops

- Sightseeing bus trip to the Flydal viewpoint
- Flydal viewpoint; Dalsnibba; the Eagle Road: photo stops

The programme

In Norway, there are roads that lead you to within a hair's breadth of the sky, at the peak of steep mountains, to discover the **Geiranger Fjord** from on high. * Climb up **by bus with your guide** and travel to the top of the first of these, to the **Flydal viewpoint**: between clicks, discover the small villages that cling to the side of the rocky mountain, appearing through the clouds. * Traveling along **Geiranger Road** is an experience that will get your blood pumping, because around every corner, the landscape reveals itself in all its majestic power. You'll see it reflected in the waters of **Djupvatn lake**. * After eleven hairpin bends, you'll already be at the top of **mount Dalsnibba**. Look out from the **panoramic terrace suspended at 1500 meters above sea level**, over villages, waterfalls and glaciers. * Then, grab your camera as you head along **Eagle Road**, which will bring you face to face with the **Seven Sisters Waterfalls**. And while you admire them, listen to the tale of their **legends**.

- Wear comfortable shoes and clothing suitable for the experience.

AMONG THE FARMERS OF THE HERDAL VALLEY

In a nutshell

Not just anyone can live in the remote **Herdal valley**: you need to be able to understand it, and respect it. A group of **local farmers** will welcome you to their **300-year-old summer farm**, not far from a **UNESCO World Heritage fjord**, to share their memories and traditions with you, along with **handmade delicacies** that taste of open-air pastures and a hard, simple life. A real return to the roots of this place.

Main stops

- Eagle Road by coach, with panoramic views of the Geirangerfjord and the Knivsflå alpine farm
- The Seven Sisters and the Suitor waterfalls: photo stop
- Visit to the Herdalssetra or Dale summer farm
- Tasting of goat's cheeses and desserts, made by the farmers
- Heregga peak and Herdøla river: photo stops on the way back

The programme

- The start is all adrenaline and amazement: the **Geirangerfjord** getting smaller and smaller below, as the coach climbs the **11 hairpin bends of the vertiginous Eagle Road**, and your **local guide** regales you with facts and legends about the place.
- There is the moving tale about **the Seven Sisters and the Suitor waterfalls** and the story of the **Knivsflå alpine farm** – unbelievable, yet true.
- But not as incredible as that of the centuries-old **Herdalssetra farm**, a remarkably beautiful and harsh place, where living means adapting to the rules and rhythms of nature.
- The **farmers** who welcome you do this every summer, when they take the livestock to pasture: **cows, sheep, goats and Fjord horses**, reared in the wild.
- In their **wooden huts**, cocooned by the warmth of the wood-burning stoves, they will reveal some of their tips for rural living: the turf covering the roofs, the importance of the Heregga peak...
- And then, they will also share the fruits of their labor with you: **you'll sample cheeses and desserts made from goat's milk using the old method**, before heading back to the sea.
- The experience includes sections on foot over steep and slippery ground. As such, for your own safety, please wear comfortable, non-slip shoes.
- Out of season or if the road to the Herdalssetra farm is rendered impassable by the winter thaw, you will be welcomed by the farmers of the DaleFarm, located further down in the valley.
- This is one of the most popular experiences so book early.

RAFT TOUR OF THE GEIRANGER FJORD**In a nutshell**

The perfect combination of breathtaking scenery, traditional landscapes and a little adrenaline, when gliding along the waters, in a raft, of the majestic fjord of Geiranger: on this excursion, we will discover one of the most magical places in Scandinavia, right from its very waters.

Main stops

- Geirangerfjord: spectacular landscapes amongst majestic mountains and unspoilt scenery
- Traditional mountain farms
- Seven Sisters Waterfall and Bridal Veil Falls

The programme

- Our tour begins at the port: we will be welcomed by our guide and will walk approximately 200 metres to our raft.
- Before setting off on this stirring excursion on the waters of the fjord, we prepare ourselves by listening to some brief safety instructions and we put on the windproof and waterproof coverall provided.
- Now the real excitement begins: our **Geirangerfjord** adventure can begin!
- The raft goes increasingly fast and the extremely pure air of the fjord can be felt on our faces providing a great sense of freedom whilst we admire the **majestic landscape**.
- Our helmsman will amaze us with a host of spectacular manoeuvres injecting a little adrenaline to the experience. The raft journey is not just about speed: the helmsman will slow down when approaching some **small mountain farms** located along the Geirangerfjord and will tell us a little bit about their history in English.
- We will admire the **Seven Sisters Waterfall and Bridal Veil Falls** up close, two of Norway's most important waterfalls, and we will discover the legend that lies behind their names. An unforgettable experience!

A panoramic tour that takes us from the splendid waterfalls of Hellesylt to the Geirangerfjord - a UNESCO site - across many villages, rivers and lakes immersed in pristine natural scenery.

Main stops

- Hellesylt Falls
- Counties of Moere og Romsdal and Sogn og Fjordane, and Stryn
- River Stryn and Hjelle
- Djupvatn Lake, panoramic point on mount Dalsnibba and breathtaking view over the entire Geirangerfjord
- Flydal Gorge

The programme

- We begin our excursion by **visiting the waterfalls in the village of Hellesylt**, which drop directly into the fjord.
- We continue on through the counties of Moere og Romsdal and Sogn og Fjordane and, after 45 minutes, we will reach **Europe's deepest lake: the Hornindalsvanet** (514 m).
- Our next stop is at the famous and magnificent **Nordfjord**, which we skirt all the way to Stryn. Here we will take a break and enjoy a little **free time**.
- We continue along the **river Stryn**, which is famous for its salmon fishing, and pass the lake of the same name before reaching Hjelle.
- The trip continues on to **Djupvasshytta** and the **panoramic view point of the Dalsnibba**, 1500 metres above sea level, which rewards us with **a breathtaking view**: glaciers, snow-capped mountains, lakes and far off, at the bottom of the Geirangerfjord, our ship.
- Having feasted our eyes on one Europe's most magnificent natural landscapes, we will begin our return trip and reach Djupvatn Lake and Mt Dalsnibba. Our last stop is Flydal Gorge, before arriving Geiranger and the ship.

Hellesylt **HIKING ACROSS THE FLO MOUNTAIN**

In a nutshell

Main stops

- Vollset, Hellesylt, the river Bygdeelva and Vollster farm
- Traditional alpine huts and mountain lakes immersed in pristine natural scenery
- The Stryn road and lake
- Lake Djupvatn and the panoramic view point on mount Dalsnibba
- Flo and its fruit trees
- A photo stop at Flydal gorge
- imposing mountains and glaciers and splendid natural landscapes
- Geiranger

The programme

- Our excursion starts at **Vollset**, taking us all the way to **Flo** along one of the main roads once used for commerce between Sunnmøre, the Nordfjord and the eastern regions, between the coastal towns and those situated inland, starting in the Middle Ages. Goods were carried on one's shoulder or on horseback as the atmospheric conditions meant that the paths were almost impassable and alternative forms of transport could not be trusted.
- From Hellesylt we follow the course of the **river Bygdeelva** and head towards the Vollster farm, which sits approximately 250 metres above sea level.
- From here we proceed on foot.
- Along the path we will see **three seter (traditional mountain farm huts)** and **numerous mountain lakes**, reaching a maximum altitude of 550 metres above sea level
- During the climb we will make a brief stop to admire the **Stryn lake**, which reflects the imposing mountains of Skåla and Lofjellet and several smaller glaciers.
- We then descend down the path in the direction of **Flo, an enchanting village sprinkled with fruit trees.**

- Here we will board the coach once more and continue our trip along the banks of the 15 km-long **Stryn lake**, which is famous for its turquoise reflections. The new Stryn mountain road passes through several tunnels making it accessible even during the winter season.
- Having reached the shore **opposite the mountains**, we continue west along the banks of lake Djupvatn. At its furthest point, we turn and take a steep toll road to reach the **panoramic view point of Dalsnibba**.
- Having admired the **unforgettable landscape** that the observation point offers us, we descend to Geiranger, making a **stop for photos at the Flydal Gorge**.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- We recommend you wear sturdy shoes that are suitable for walking.
- We recommend that you bring a wind-proof jacket as the mountain air can be cold even on a sunny day.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- For safety reasons, if the road to Mount Dalsnibba is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.
- Participants will rejoin the ship at Geiranger.

Main stops

- Art Nouveau Centre
- Art Nouveau in town
- Park at the foot of Mount Aksla: commemorative stone to William II and the statue of the Viking warrior 'Gange-Rolv'

The programme

- Let's discover Ålesund, the largest town on the north-west coast of Norway, built on islands extending into the ocean which stand out against the splendid backdrop of impressive mountain peaks..
- A large part of the town was destroyed by the fire of 1904. It was rebuilt in the typical Art Nouveau style of the first decade of the twentieth century .
- It was the German Emperor William II, a great friend of the Norwegian kings, who used to spend his holidays in district of Sunnmøre, to send four ships laden with help for the town. The central nucleus was rebuilt in bricks and stone to restrict any further fires.
- Today, Ålesund has a population of about 66,000, although the town centre is relatively small and is easy to visit on foot.
- Our tour begins with a visit to the **Art Nouveau Centre**, a museum in one of the most beautifully decorated buildings in this style: it used to be a pharmacy and inside it still houses the vintage containers of herbs and medicines on its shelves.
- The three-storey museum provides an interesting overview of the history of Ålesund, of the fire in 1904 and of the creative period in the Art Nouveau style.
- During our journey, we will be told of the importance of the fishmongers in Norway's largest port for the export of fish. We'll have the opportunity of seeing various examples of the **Art Nouveau style of the town's architecture**, which has made Ålesund famous as one of the last three Art Nouveau towns in Europe.,
- Our excursion continues to climb up to the small **park at the foot of Mount Aksla**.
- We'll see numerous **plants** in the park as well as a commemorative stone dedicated to the emperor William II for the help he gave to the town after the fire of 1904. Here stands the **statue of the Viking warrior Sange-Rolv** who sailed from Ålesund to today's Normandy, the name of which comes from the Norwegian conquerors.
- We can walk round the park and take a break before returning to the quayside and to our ship.
- Guests must be able to walk for approximately 3 km on steep, asphalted and cobbled terrain.

- Next we will visit **Giske church**, built in 1150; the inner and outer walls are covered with white marble. It was originally a family chapel belonging to the powerful Giske clan. The church boasts a multi-coloured altarpiece and a finely carved pulpit.
- Then we will travel to the second island on our tour, the island of Godøy, with its unique structure, almost divided into two by a mountain range.
- Here, we will visit the **lighthouse** from 1876 located in the small **fishing village of Alnes** overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. To truly appreciate the sense of isolation here, visitors who wish to do so can climb the stairs up the five floors of the wooden structure which lead to the top of the lighthouse, up to the circular balcony. Every floor features paintings created by the famous Norwegian artist, Ørnulf Opdahl.
- Before returning on-board, we will visit the **Ålesund Aquarium**, one of the most characteristic in Europe. Large salted water pools are lined up along the coast, providing us with the opportunity to get to know the underwater world of the northern Atlantic. - In the event of less favourable conditions, we will stay in the sheltered waters of Ålesund. There are also many birds here and, with a bit of luck, we may even get to catch a glimpse of an eagle ray.
- Our guide will help us to spot some interesting examples of the **local fauna** and will take us near a rock where we can watch the **seals** basking in the sun.
- A maximum of 12 guests per departure is permitted.
- You must be physically fit to take part in this excursion and not suffer from back pain.

- From the bottom of the fjord, everything looks immense. Like its king: it is called **Preikestolen**, the famous 'rock pulpit', a granite cliff that is an amazing 604 meters high. Very few people are lucky enough to see it from the water like you.
- Your captain will point out one curiosity after another: from the **first house built on the fjord** to a **cave** that **thieves** once used to...communicate. Focus your gaze: can you see something embedded in the rock?

- We will then continue by coach to the **Preikestolen Refuge**.
- From there, we will walk along a rocky mountain path to admire the stunning views dotted with small lakes. This area, which is home to a substantial population of ptarmigan, is well-known to local hunters and fishermen.
- Continuing our walking tour, we will reach the **Preikestolen (the 'pulpit'rock)**, a flat rock that overlooks the Lysefjord from a height of 604 metres above sea level. From here, we can enjoy beautiful views of the surrounding mountains.
- After our visit, we will return along the same path to the Preikestolen Refuge, where our coach will be waiting to take us back to Stavanger.
- The Preikestolen area is not secure. We therefore recommend you move with caution and keep a safe distance from the cliff edge.
- The experience takes place on an uneven mountain track that also has steep sections. Accordingly, for your own safety, it is important to wear walking shoes. If you do not have any with you, they can be rented on site.
- We recommend you wear a waterproof windbreaker over your clothes.
- This outdoor excursion will take place in all weathers, with the exception of snow.
- The walk covers a distance of approximately 8 km with a difference in height of approximately 340 metres from start to finish and is only recommended for guests accustomed to walking on rough paths.

The programme

- We will set off from the port by coach through **Ullandhaug**, an area famous for its reconstructions of Iron Age farms. Ullandhaug also boasts breath-taking views of the **Hafrsfjord** where, in 872, the Viking king Harald Fairhair defeated the last of the local princes and unified 29 small kingdoms under one crown, founding the Kingdom of Norway. To the east stretches the fertile **landscape of Jæren**, with the **Ryfylke Mountains** in the distance.
- We will then continue to the outskirts of Stavanger to admire the **Sverd i fjell ('Swords in Rock')**, a fascinating memorial by the sculptor Fritz Røed. The monument depicts three 10 metre-high swords that commemorate the historic battle of Hafrsfjord. The largest sword represents the victorious Harald, while the smaller ones symbolise the vanquished kings. The monument is also intended to symbolise peace, as the swords are struck in solid rock, from which they can never be removed.
- We will now pass through both the older and more modern districts of Stavanger; we will admire the outside of the **Cathedral**, built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester with the help of British craftsmen. Of all the churches built in Norway during the Middle Ages, Stavanger Cathedral is the only one that still retains its original features.
- Before returning to the ship, we will treat ourselves to a walk through 'Old Stavanger', with its typical narrow streets lined with picturesque wooden houses that date back to the 18th and 19th centuries, a time when it was home to sailors, craftsmen and merchants. This unique area, located just a few minutes from the port, is now at the centre of the city's most ambitious redevelopment project.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- The Cathedral is currently under renovation, so the visit will be from outside.

- A short walk will take us to the **market square** and the **harbour bay**. During the summer months, you will have the opportunity to browse the stalls and admire the wide range of fruit and vegetable.
- On leaving the square, we will continue to the **Cathedral** for an outside visit Dedicated to St. Svithun, patron saint of the city, and built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester, with the help of British craftsmen, Stavanger Cathedral is the best-preserved medieval church in Norway, second only to the Nidaros Cathedral in Trondheim.
- After admiring the cathedral, we will return to the port.

- We will now head west over a stunning **mountainous landscape** dotted with lakes, before returning towards the fjord and eventually the heliport.

- And if you're still hungry for more maritime discoveries, **you can explore Kiel however you like**, before returning to the ship.

LUBECK, THE BALTIC JEWEL

You will start with Lubeck's Holsten Gate, where you have your first of many photo opportunities. The gate from the 15th century is the landmark of Lubeck, which is symbol not only of the well-fortified medieval town but also of the self-confidence of the former Queen of the Hanseatic League. Your walking tour starts at the city center. Your tour leads through the picturesque Old Town which was declared a World Cultural Heritage Site by the UNESCO in 1987. Walking the historic alleyways and courtyards, see the Seven Spires and the Hospital of the Holy Spirit dating back to 1280. This hospital is not only one of Europe's oldest social institutions but also one of the most significant monumental buildings from the Middle Ages. Proceed to the historic Town Hall which was built in the 13th century and is considered to be one of the oldest, most magnificent in Germany. Have a view at the St. Mary's Church which is the third-largest church building in Germany. Of particular interest are also numerous 15th- and 16th-century patrician residences and salt storehouses. Pass by the Buddenbrook House, the former home of the Lubeck-born authors Heinrich and Thomas Mann. Another highlight is the

unique Marzipan-exhibition in the trademark Café Niederegger. Enjoy your free time for having a lunch break and for exploring the narrow, cobble-stoned streets and the variety of small and elegant shops. The tower was first erected to commemorate the soldiers of the German Navy who died in the First World War. Later, it was also dedicated to the sailors who died in the Second World War. In 1954, it became a memorial to all the fallen from the Navies of all nationalities.
- After an interesting visit to the **exhibition inside the monument**, we climb to the top of the building to enjoy the **spectacular view** that unfolds before us.
- Lastly, the **U995 submarine**, one of the dreaded U-Boats that destroyed the allied ships in the north-eastern Atlantic, awaits us on the nearby beach. Today, it houses a museum where we can learn about some of the aspects of the hard life of the crew on board submarines.
- Our visit to the memorial is over and we set off by coach for Hamburg airport.
- We recommend wearing comfortable shoes.

- Our tour ends in the **Krameramtsstuben** area, a complex of 5 buildings, built between 1620 and 1676 by the merchants' guild to provide homes for traders' widows. They are well preserved and give us an idea of what life was like at the beginning of the 18th century.
- Afterwards our coach will bring you to Hamburg airport.

- Here we find some of the city's most interesting sights: the **Stock Exchange**, and **Christiansborg Palace**, home to the Danish Parliament and many of the country's other political institutions.
- We cross old canals and streets ensconced between ancient buildings to reach the pedestrian walkway that crosses the entire city. Our guide will point out the **famous Royal Copenhagen shop** where we can go on our own and admire the unique quality of its renowned, hand-painted, blue and white porcelain, and the hand-hammered silverware and hand blown glassware.
- At the end we will drive back to the pier crossing by the **City Hall, Tivoli Gardens** and **Rosenborg Castle**.

Number of participants

Some excursions require a minimum number of bookings and/or a maximum number of participants. These excursions are available on a first come first served basis, so it is advisable to book them well in advance.

Duration

The stated duration of excursions is subject to change without prior notice and can vary due to unforeseen circumstances, such as adverse weather conditions and/or transport delays. The order of certain visits may also be changed for the abovementioned reasons. Children and kids
