THE BRIKSDAL GLACIER: NATURE TO TAKE YOUR BREATH AWAY

In a nutshell

Leaving from **Hellesylt**, you will be amazed by its waterfall plunging into the fjord, in the emerald green and deep blue waters. You will go past the **Olden** valley and villages of **Nordfjord**, lakes and spectacular mountains.

You will then walk up to the **Briksdal glacier**, a part of the imposing Jostedalbreen glacier system, along wooden bridges and past streams, before the majestic ice appears before you. After a typical lunch, you will continue up the mountain road of **Stryn** to take the perfect photo at **Flydal**, with the ship in the background. Nature, emotions and Northern scenery all in a unique tour.

Main stops

- Village of Hellesylt and Hellesylt waterfall
- Lake Hornindalsvanet
- Nordfjord, villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden
- Briksdal Glacier and spectacular nature
- Mountain lodge near the glacier with a stop for lunch
- Road to Stryn, return trip via Geiranger, tunnels and panoramic viewpoint at Flydal Gorge

The programme

- Our excursion begins in the **village of Hellesylt**, where we can admire the majestic **waterfall** of the same name, whose waters cascade down to the shimmering emerald green and ultramarine blue fjord below.
- We continue our journey towards **Hornindalsvanet** which, at a depth of 514 metres, can claim to be Europe's deepest lake; before us lies the magnificent **Nordfjord**, alongside the road through the villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden. This fascinating village nestles at the bottom of the fjord and stretches along numerous lakes in the Olden Valley as far as the mountain lodge at the Briksdal Glacier.
- Our walk takes us through stunning nature to the **Briksdal Glacier**, a branch of the mighty **Jostedalbreen Glacier**, the largest in Europe.
- At first, the path climbs and crosses over the waterfall on a wooden bridge.
- At this point we find ourselves standing face to face with the massive glacier.
- We'll then walk back the same way to the mountain lodge, where we'll enjoy an **excellent lunch**.
- Back on our journey, we cross the valley alongside the extraordinarily beautiful lake towards Stryn.
- We climb the **mountain road to Stryn**, which used to link eastern Norway with the west.
- Our return journey to Geiranger runs through quite a few tunnels, and we make a final stop at **Flydal**

to take a few snapshots of our ship, waiting for us in the fjord.

THE STORSÆTER WATERFALL: TREKKING IN THE MOUNTAINS

In a nutshell

From **Geiranger** you will ascend up hairpin bends past stunning scenery, then leave the coach to hike **on foot** past pastures and along mountain paths. The **destination is the Storsæter waterfall**, where you can walk right under the water, for a unique experience. The route ends at **Westerås farm**, with views over the fjord, for a refreshing break, before returning. Pure nature, true emotions.

Main stops

- Geiranger Church
- Hole Camping
- Hiking in the mountains
- Storsæter waterfall
- Westerås farm
- Drink at the farm

The programme

- We will leave the dock by coach and prepare ourselves for the ride up the hill whilst we pass **Geiranger church**, an octagonal wooden building with a slate roof nestled into the rocks.
- After a number of twists and turns, we will reach **Hole Camping**. We will leave the coach there and start our excursion on foot.
- Our route will see us **zig-zagging up the mountain** and crossing summer pastures. In the past, all the straw available was used, even the straw that grew in the most inaccessible places. It was collected and sent down the valley using the *løypestreng*, a cable that stretched to the nearest barn.
- Our destination is the **spectacular Storsæter waterfall**, which gushes out from a height of 30 metres forming a large curve so we can walk right under it!

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- After admiring this incredible view, we will hike down to **Westerås farm**, which lies on a projection jutting out over Geiranger.
- Uninhabited during winter and at the beginning of spring due to the danger of avalanches, it is a hive of activity during the summer months and it is here that we will be served **a drink**.
- After relaxing for a while, we will have some **free time** to look around the farm before returning on foot to Hole Camping where our coach will be waiting to take us back to the quay in Geiranger.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- The walk to the waterfall takes around 1 hour (3 km) and covers rough ground and steep sections so it may be tiring.
- We recommend wearing walking shoes and suitable clothing.

GEIRANGERFJORD & TROLLSTIGEN: ENDLESS LANDSCAPES

In a nutshell

Fjords, mountains and landscapes that are truly unique: get ready to experience pure Norway. You'll start from **Hellesylt** and stop off at the most spectacular viewpoints of the **Geirangerfjord**, then go up **Mount Stranda** in a cable car with all-round panoramas of the fjords, glaciers and snow-capped mountains. From the top, you can admire the Unesco World Heritage Site Geirangerfjord, and then experience the fjord from the water, with a **ferry crossing** past waterfalls and rock faces. And the gran finale is thrilling: along the **Trollstigen** road, with its tight hairpin binds, on to the Ørnesvingen viewing platform, in front of the **Seven Sisters waterfall**. An unforgettable experience.

Main stops

- Viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord
- Stranda mountain and spectacular cable car
- Lunch at a restaurant

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- Ferry ride across the fjord
- Trollstigen (photostop)
- Ørnesvingen viewpoint and Seven Sisters waterfall
- Geiranger

The programme

- We will leave the port of Hellesylt and head north, soon making a stop at the **viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord**, where we can take photos of the breathtaking views with our cameras.
- Afterwards, we will continue to **Mount Stranda**, a renowned ski resort offering breathtaking views of the surrounding snowy peaks as well as the majestic Storfjord.
- We will leave our coach behind us and climb to the top on a **spectacular cable car** whose large windows offer us 360° views of the fjord and mountains.
- The cable car runs to 1042 metres above sea level, where we can feel in **direct contact with nature** as we see goats grazing in summer and plenty of snow for the kids to play in.
- From the top of the mountain we can enjoy **exceptional views** of the majestic Geirangerfjord, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Jostedal glacier, the largest in Europe situated on dry land.
- We will then **cross the Geirangerfjord on a ferry**, marvelling at the steep, imposing mountains with their countless waterfalls dropping down towards the sea.
- Our next destination is a photostop at the famous **Trollstigen** or 'Trolls' Path', an engineering feat consisting of an extremely narrow scenic road with 11 hairpin bends and a hair-raising steep gradient, surrounded by majestic mountains and stunning waterfalls.
- Back down at the fjord, we will take the ferry back across it and stop at the **Ørnesvingen viewpoint**, which literally means Eagles' Turn, where we can admire and take photos of the Geirangerfjord and the **Seven Sisters waterfall**, so called because it splits into seven rivulets over the rock face.
- Then we will travel along the last section of the road and stop in **Geiranger**, our final destination.
- The excursion starts in Hellesylt and ends in Geiranger.
- For safety reasons, if Trollstigen road is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.

Geiranger **HELICOPTER TOUR OF GEIRANGERFJORD**

In a nutshell

An extraordinary helicopter experience discovering the natural wonders and beautiful landscape of Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, from a unique perspective up above. We will see its picture-postcard scenery: majestic snow-capped mountains, rugged cliffs, cascading waterfalls, and small colourful farms nestled in the lush vegetation. An unmissable tour for nature lovers and more!

Main stops

- Helicopter flight over Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Breathtaking views of the surrounding snow-capped mountains
- Mount Dalsnibba, rugged cliffs, waterfalls, farms, glaciers

The programme

- We will take to the skies for this excursion on a **helicopter ride** and soar over **one of the most famous and spectacular fjords** in Norway: **Geirangerfjord**, declared a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** in 2005.
- We will cover the full length of the fjord, around 15 km, starting at sea level and rising to the summit of the **surrounding snow-capped mountains**: we will be amazed by the **breathtaking views and steep, rugged cliffs** with powerful **waterfalls** (such as the "Seven Sisters" or "Bridal Veil Falls"), which create light veils of mist that produce an endless display of ever-changing rainbows, which will leave us lost for words.
- We will fly to **Mount Dalsnibba**, 1500 metres high, which towers over the tourist town of Geiranger, located at the end of the fjord. We will be able to see **small farms** from up here, nestled in the foothills of the mountains, and higher up **glaciers** with ice caves and small icy waterfalls.
- As we fly back along the fjord to return to base, we will notice the lush vegetation beneath us, a fundamental part of this wild and exciting natural landscape.
- The flight lasts approximately 30 minutes.
- The flight, landing and routes may be subject to change depending on weather conditions and are at the pilot's discretion.
- The flight times are indicative and include landing.

The programme

Forget calm strolls along the fjord. With this tour, we will take you straight to the heart of the **Geirangerfjord**, a UNESCO world heritage site, and we'll do so at **top speed!** Jump aboard our **RIB** and get ready to feel the wind in your face as you race across the crystal-clear waters of the fjord.

We'll set off straight after the ship from Helligsøylt and we'll follow her route all the way to Geiranger. And guess what? We'll be following her for real! Our RIB will reach the ship and speed along beside her, giving you a spectacular perspective.

Along the way, we'll make several stops in strategic points, where you'll get so close to the natural wonders of the fjord that you'll almost be able to touch them. Every corner of this place is a show-stopper, with views and panoramas that will leave you speechless.

GEIRANGERFJORD: KAYAKING ON THE FJORD

In a nutshell

Experience the **Geirangerfjord** in the fjord itself, **paddling in a kayak** between majestic mountains, sheer drops and farms clinging to the cliff-tops. Glide silently through the water, breathe in the purest air and feel at one with some of the most spectacular scenery the world over. A slow-paced, intense and exceptional experience.

Main stops

- Geirangerfjord: breathtaking scenery and clifftop farms

The programme

- The **Geirangerfjord** is described as the most beautiful fjord in the world: we will set off on a kayak

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journey surrounded by magnificent and striking mountains, which, with their steep faces, reach heights of up to 1,500 metres.

- Grip those paddles and away we go: we will admire the **brehtaking scenery and the farms perched on their rocky outcrops**. According to local folklore, farmers would tie ropes to their children and animals to prevent them from falling from the high walls of rock. We will skim the waters and breathe in the extremely fresh air of the fjord: what better way to feel the strength and greatness of mother nature in person than on a kayak tour?
- Our kayak will follow the outline of the basin, which curves between two tower-shaped mountains. It is a magical and majestic place at any time of the year.
- After admiring the verdant nature and the striking rock formations of the fjord, we will set off on the return journey, during which our guide will tell us the history of Geiranger and its population.
- You must be physically fit to take part in this excursion and not suffer from back pain.
- You must be able to swim.
- No prior kayak experience is required.
- The excursion includes a 5 minute walk to the kayak platform, where participants will receive safety instructions and information on how to paddle.
- Minimum age for the kayak excursion with an adult: 12 yrs.
- Maximum weight: 120 kg.

- From here we proceed on foot.
- Along the path we will see **three seter (traditional mountain farm huts) and numerous mountain lakes**, reaching a maximum altitude of 550 metres above sea level
- During the climb we will make a brief stop to admire the **Stryn lake**, which reflects the imposing mountains of Skåla and Lofjellet and several smaller glaciers.
- We then descend down the path in the direction of **Flo, an enchanting village sprinkled with fruit trees**.
- Here we will board the coach once more and continue our trip along the banks of the 15 km-long **Stryn lake**, which is famous for its turquoise reflections. The new Stryn mountain road passes

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through several tunnels making it accessible even during the winter season.

- Having reached the shore **opposite the mountains**, we continue west along the banks of lake Djupvatn. At its furthest point, we turn and take a steep toll road to reach the **panoramic view point of Dalsnibba**.
- Having admired the **unforgettable landscape** that the observation point offers us, we descend to Geiranger, making a **stop for photos at the Flydal Gorge**.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- We recommend you wear sturdy shoes that are suitable for walking.
- We recommend that you bring a wind-proof jacket as the mountain air can be cold even on a sunny day.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- For safety reasons, if the road to Mount Dalsnibba is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.
- Participants will rejoin the ship at Geiranger.

ALL OF BERGEN: THE GRAND BUILDINGS, MARKETS AND HISTORIC STREETS

In a nutshell

Set off to discover **Bergen** by **coach** and explore the best this location has to offer. Admire King Haakon's Hall and the Rosenkrantz tower, stroll past the colorful wooden houses of the **Bryggen district, a UNESCO world heritage site** and take in the lively atmosphere of the fish market. Discover the delightful Nordnes peninsula, its panoramic views and the Bergen **Aquarium** before returning to ship, with some free time for further exploration.

Main stops

- Panoramic tour of Bergen
- Hanseatic Quarter of Bryggen
- Nordnes Peninsula

The programme

- We leave the port by coach and set off to explore **Bergen**, the second largest city in Norway after the current capital, Oslo. Bergen was founded in 1070 AD. Between the 12th and 13th centuries the city was the capital of Norgesveldet, the Norwegian Empire which included Iceland, Greenland and part of Scotland. Bergen flourished thanks to the export of fish (mostly dried fish) which was the city's main product in the Middle Ages. Even after Oslo became capital in 1299, Bergen continued to grow as a business centre, becoming the largest in Norway.
- Our panoramic tour begins by passing in front of some of the city's most important and symbolic landmarks, including **King Haakon's Hall** (Håkonshallen), the imperial residence, and the **Rosenkrantz Tower** (Rosenkrantzårnet), built around 1560 by the Governor of Bergen Tower, Erik Rosenkrantz, to serve as both as a residence and a fortified tower.
- Our tour then continues to the other symbol of the city, the ancient and picturesque **wharf district of Bryggen** ("bryggen" in Norwegian means "wharf"), which was built around 1350 by the Hanseatic League. It is the most enchanting neighbourhood of the city and extends along the eastern side of the port of Vågen, with long parallel rows of coloured buildings with sloping roofs (and leaning walls, in many cases), which are built with rough wooden planks on stacked-stone or wooden foundations. In the past, these buildings were used as offices, homes and stores and were used by the German merchants of the Hanseatic League, which enjoyed a trade monopoly with Norway. Today the Bryggen District is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and boasts shops, restaurants, cafés and artisan workshops.
- Passing by the bustling **Fish Market** (Fisketorget), we head for the **Nordnes Peninsula**, with its typical 19th-century white wooden houses. The **Bergen Aquarium** (Akvariet) at the tip of the peninsula, boasts one of the largest collections of marine and freshwater fish and invertebrates in Europe, in addition to seals and penguins; in the tropical section there are crocodiles, snakes, turtles and monkeys.
- As we continue on our way, we enjoy the splendid panorama that opens up on both sides of the port and, before returning to the ship, we cross the Fish Market once again and head for the **Øvregaten**, the oldest street in Bergen.
- Those who wish can stay a little longer at the Fish Market and return to the ship independently.
- The tour is suitable for people with disabilities and those with mobility problems as long as they can board the coach autonomously.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.

- When we arrive in Voss, we will board a train that will take us along the main railway line. We will cross **Raundalen mountain valley** and **Gravhalsen tunnel**, winding down Flåm valley for another 5 kilometres until we reach Myrdal.
- That is where our adventure along the **Flåm railway line** begins. It is a spectacular, intrepid journey that Lonely Planet calls the most beautiful train ride in the world.
- Along the 20-km route, one of the steepest in the world, our train will follow the tracks that wind along the **majestic Sognefjord** while we admire rivers that have carved out deep gorges, waterfalls that jet out over the precipices of jagged mountains and farms clinging to rocky crags.
- A stop is also planned at the stunning **Kjosfossen waterfall** where we can take incredible photos.

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- When we reach Flåm station, we will get back on our coach and continue our tour through two tunnels that open out onto **Nærøysfjord**, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its unrivalled beauty, and then make our way to **Nærøy valley**.
- We will then head to **Oppheim lake** and stop again for photos at **Tvinde waterfall** before returning to Voss and then to the ship.
- Lunch will be served during the journey.

IN THE HEART OF BERGEN: ON FOOT AND BY FUNICULAR RAILWAY

In a nutshell

Discover Bergen on foot, wandering down the alleys of **Bryggen**, past colorful facades and craft shops, then take the **funicular** up to Floyen for breathtaking views over the fjord and North Sea. Markets, wooden houses and the rebuilt stave church **Fantoft Stavkirke** round off the tour with its historic echoes, nature and fairytale atmosphere.

Main stops

- Håkonshallen, Rosenkrantz Tower and Bryggen Hanseatic Wharf
- Fløibanen Funicular, Mount Fløien
- Central Park and Lake
- Residential area, wooden houses, gardens, Royal Residence, the wooden Fantoft Stavkirke (stave church)

The programme

- Our tour begins with passing by **King Haakon's Hall** (Håkonshallen), the imperial residence with adjoining banquet hall built by King Håkon Håkonsson in 1261 and the nearby **Rosenkrantz Tower** (Rosenkrantzårnet), which was built around 1560 by the Governor of Bergen, Erik Rosenkrantz, to serve both as a residence and a fortified tower. Today it even incorporates part of the keep (1273) of King Magnus the Lawmender and Jørgen Hansson's fortress of 1520.
- We will stop on at the picturesque old **wharf district of Bryggen** ("bryggen" in Norwegian means

"wharf"), which was built around 1350 by the Hanseatic League. It is the most picturesque district of Bergen, extending along the eastern side of the port of Vågen, with its long parallel rows of colourful buildings. Once, these buildings were used as offices, homes and stores by the German merchants of the Hanseatic League. Today the Bryggen District is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and boasts shops, restaurants, cafés and artisan workshops. We wander around the alleys between the picturesque warehouses that line the street and along the seafront to enjoy the quaint atmosphere of this neighbourhood.

- We then arrive at the **Fløibanen funicular** station, which has been in operation since 1910. Once aboard, we are transported up the 26% gradient to an altitude of 320 metres a journey of about 8 minutes to reach the summit of **Mount Fløien** (one of the seven mountains that surround Bergen, its name derives from the wind vane placed at the summit many centuries ago to indicate the force and direction of the wind to sailors entering or leaving the port below). Mount Fløien is very popular with the inhabitants of Bergen as a recreation area all year round. From the summit the view is truly impressive: we can see the heart of Bergen at our feet and looking to the west, on a clear day, you can also see the North Sea, and the neighbouring archipelagos.
 - We take the funicular back down, and after boarding the coach, we cross the **Fish Market** square, with its seafood, flowers, fruit and vegetables and souvenir stalls and we head for the **central park** and the **lake**.
 - We then go through the **residential area**, admiring the well-preserved **wooden houses**, the **gardens** and the **Royal Residence** on our way to **Fantoft Stavkirke**. This wooden **stave church**, located in an enchanting wooded area to the south of Bergen, was rebuilt in 1992 after a terrible fire and is the exact replica of the original building which dated back to 1150. In the Middle Ages, in Norway, there were at least 800 of these typical stave churches; today there are only 30 remaining.
 - Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
 - In the event of inclement weather, the view from the platform of the funicular may not be ideal; in these conditions you are also advised to wear appropriate clothing.
- The funicular is very popular among both locals as well as visitors; therefore, long lines at the Funicular should be expected.

FUNICULAR RIDE AND HIKING ON MOUNT FLØIEN

In a nutshell

An unmissable excursion by funicular and on foot to enjoy spectacular views of Bergen and its surroundings from the top of Mount Fløien; breathtaking views that embrace the fjord, the city and the surrounding landscape!

Main stops

- Fløibanen Funicular, Mount Fløien, panoramic view of Bergen
- Hiking on the Fløien Hills, Lake Skomakerdiket, the Blåmansveien hiking trail

The programme

- We begin our excursion walking to the Fløibanen funicular station, which has been in operation since 1910. Once aboard, we are transported up the 26% gradient to an altitude of 320 metres a journey of about 8 minutes to reach the summit of **Mount Fløien** (one of the seven mountains that surround Bergen, its name derives from the wind vane placed at the summit many centuries ago to indicate the force and direction of the wind to sailors entering or leaving the port below). Both the funicular ride and the belvedere at the top offer a magnificent **panorama of Bergen** and its surroundings.
- After the funicular ride, we begin our **walking tour of the Fløien Hills**, a very popular recreational spot with the inhabitants of Bergen all year round. We walk along one of the many gravel roads, which leads us through woods with gentle hills, until we come to the small, idyllic **Lake Skomakerdiket**; we then take the **main Blåmansveien hiking trail**.
- As we walk uphill, the view becomes increasingly spectacular: we can see the fjord with its many islands, the city of Bergen at our feet and the North Sea in the distance to the west.
- After walking for about 2.5 km, we come to a crossroads. If the weather is favourable, we take the **Rundemansvegroad** and, as we leave the trees behind us, a broad panorama opens before us on all sides. We then come to the highest point, **Rundemanen**, at an altitude of approximately 570 metres, where we stop to rest and enjoy the fresh air.
- Depending on how physically fit you are, and the weather conditions, there is the possibility to extend or shorten the hike. In any case, at the end of the hike we go back down to the city with the funicular.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- The excursion foreseen a total of approximately 10 km of walking you are therefore advised to wear trekking or sports shoes and comfortable multi-layered clothing.
- Minors under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

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- Participants should bring along clothing that is appropriate for the weather conditions, a backpack for personal items and water to stay hydrated along the way.
- To participate in this excursion, you must be physically fit; the tour is not recommended for those who have mobility problems, heart problems or knee problems.

And the name of the museum?

Arquebus was a local partisan cipher. So yes, even history can have a touch of espionage! Amidst mannequins in uniform, authentic clothing, and realistic settings, we almost feel like part of the story. After getting our fill of history, we head up to **Steinsfjellet**, at a height of 227 meters, where we can enjoy a breathtaking view of Haugesund and the surrounding area. Here you'll understand why the locals love to walk: amazing views, fresh air, and the feeling of being on top of the world.

We continue on to **Haraldshaugen**, a national monument dating back to 1872 that commemorates the 1000th anniversary of the Battle of Hafrsfjord (872 AD). **It was here that Harald Fairhair united Norway**, setting up his court in Avaldsnes. Today, the monument marks what is believed to be his burial site, a few miles from Haugesund... the perfect spot for taking epic photos fit for a Viking king.

Then on to the **historic city center, a Unesco World Heritage site**, past the Seven Towers and the imposing **Hospital of the Holy Spirit**. You'll pass the **Gothic Town Hall**, admire the magnificent **Church of Saint Mary**, the grand homes of noble families and the salt warehouses. A nod to the Mann family at Buddenbrook House and then indulge in the legendary **Niederegger Marzipan**. Afterwards enjoy some free time for shopping and refreshments.

The programme

Lubeck has much to offer, not only for the historians among you!

Start off at the pier in Kiel with an approx. 1,5 h scenic transfer to Lubeck. You will start with Lubeck's **Holsten Gate**, where you have your first of many photo opportunities. The gate from the 15th century is the landmark of Lubeck, which is symbol not only of the well-fortified medieval town but also of the self-confidence of the former Queen of the Hanseatic League.

Your walking tour starts at the city center. Your tour leads through the picturesque **Old Town** which was declared a World Cultural Heritage Site by the UNESCO in 1987. Walking the historic alleyways and courtyards, see **the Seven Spires and the Hospital of the Holy Spirit** dating back to 1280. This hospital is not only one of Europe's oldest social institutions but also one of the most significant monumental buildings from the Middle Ages.

Proceed to the historic **Town Hall** which was built in the 13th century and is considered to be one of the

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oldest, most magnificent in Germany. Have a view at the **St. Mary's Church** which is the third-largest church building in Germany. Of particular interest are also numerous 15th- and 16th-century patrician residences and salt storehouses.

Pass by the **Buddenbrook House**, the former home of the Lubeck-born authors Heinrich and Thomas Mann.

Another highlight is the unique Marzipan-exhibition in the trademark **Café Niederegger**.

Enjoy your **free time** for having a lunch break and for exploring the narrow, cobble-stoned streets and the variety of small and elegant shops.

KIEL AND LABOE: CANALS, SAILORS AND SUBMARINES – the tour ends at the airport

You'll set off from the port, to discover the maritime heart of **Kiel**, its grand **Town Hall** and the immense **Canal**, winding its way between two seas and centuries of history. - Also not to be missed is a visit to the city's royal residences: the palaces at **Amalienborg** - residence of the present Queen - which is guarded by soldiers in traditional bearskin hats.
- We follow our tour in the **historic centre district of Indre By**. Here we find Rosenborg Castle, **Strøget - Europe's longest pedestrianised shopping street**, the magnificent **City Hall** with its distinctive decorations, the monuments and maritime symbols that adorn City Hall Square, and the magnificent world famous **Tivoli Gardens**.
- We will stop in the very **heart of the city** where we can savour the capital's unique atmosphere, enjoying a relaxing stroll, sipping a drink in one of the countless coffee houses or picking up a final souvenir or two, also enjoy exploring the city centre using your **free time**.
- Our visit ends with **Christianborg Palace** and the **Royal Receptions Rooms** and after this visit we will direct ourselves to Ocean Quay, just next to the pier.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- Christiansborg Palace reserves the right to close its rooms to the public and cancel bookings whenever it is needed by the government or the royal family.
- This excursion is reserved for guests who do not disembark in Copenhagen.

Excursion Booking

You can book excursions before departure by visiting the website www.mycosta.com, or by requesting to be contacted by our "Excursion Service" at +34 932952144 or through a request on the MyCosta website. Once on board, excursions can be booked through the Costa App, the Excursion Totem, or by visiting the MyTours office, where our staff will be available to offer advice and assistance.

Participation

Some excursions require a minimum number of bookings and have a maximum number of participants, so it is advisable to book them in advance.

Duration

The duration of the excursions is indicated in the description of each tour. Due to unforeseen circumstances, such as adverse weather conditions and/or transport delays, the duration may be subject to change.
