THE STORSÆTER WATERFALL: TREKKING IN THE MOUNTAINS

In a nutshell

From **Geiranger** you will ascend up hairpin bends past stunning scenery, then leave the coach to hike **on foot** past pastures and along mountain paths. The **destination is the Storsæter waterfall**, where you can walk right under the water, for a unique experience. The route ends at **Westerås farm**, with views over the fjord, for a refreshing break, before returning. Pure nature, true emotions.

Main stops

- Geiranger Church
- Hole Camping
- Hiking in the mountains
- Storsæter waterfall
- Westerås farm
- Drink at the farm

The programme

- We will leave the dock by coach and prepare ourselves for the ride up the hill whilst we pass **Geiranger church**, an octagonal wooden building with a slate roof nestled into the rocks.
- After a number of twists and turns, we will reach **Hole Camping**. We will leave the coach there and start our excursion on foot.
- Our route will see us **zig-zagging up the mountain** and crossing summer pastures. In the past, all the straw available was used, even the straw that grew in the most inaccessible places. It was collected and sent down the valley using the *løypestreng*, a cable that stretched to the nearest barn.
- Our destination is the **spectacular Storsæter waterfall**, which gushes out from a height of 30 metres forming a large curve so we can walk right under it!
- After admiring this incredible view, we will hike down to **Westerås farm**, which lies on a projection jutting out over Geiranger.
- Uninhabited during winter and at the beginning of spring due to the danger of avalanches, it is a hive of activity during the summer months and it is here that we will be served **a drink**.
- After relaxing for a while, we will have some **free time** to look around the farm before returning on foot to Hole Camping where our coach will be waiting to take us back to the quay in Geiranger.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- The walk to the waterfall takes around 1 hour (3 km) and covers rough ground and steep sections

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so it may be tiring.

- We recommend wearing walking shoes and suitable clothing.

THE BRIKSDAL GLACIER: NATURE TO TAKE YOUR BREATH AWAY

In a nutshell

Leaving from **Hellesylt**, you will be amazed by its waterfall plunging into the fjord, in the emerald green and deep blue waters. You will go past the **Olden** valley and villages of **Nordfjord**, lakes and spectacular mountains.

You will then walk up to the **Briksdal glacier**, a part of the imposing Jostedalsglaciers glacier system, along wooden bridges and past streams, before the majestic ice appears before you. After a typical lunch, you will continue up the mountain road of **Stryn** to take the perfect photo at **Flydal**, with the ship in the background. Nature, emotions and Northern scenery all in a unique tour.

Main stops

- Village of Hellesylt and Hellesylt waterfall
- Lake Hornindalsvanet
- Nordfjord, villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden
- Briksdal Glacier and spectacular nature
- Mountain lodge near the glacier with a stop for lunch
- Road to Stryn, return trip via Geiranger, tunnels and panoramic viewpoint at Flydal Gorge

The programme

- Our excursion begins in the **village of Hellesylt**, where we can admire the majestic **waterfall** of the same name, whose waters cascade down to the shimmering emerald green and ultramarine blue fjord below.
- We continue our journey towards **Hornindalsvanet** which, at a depth of 514 metres, can claim to be Europe's deepest lake; before us lies the magnificent **Nordfjord**, alongside the road through the villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden. This fascinating village nestles at the bottom of the fjord and

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stretches along numerous lakes in the Olden Valley as far as the mountain lodge at the Briksdal Glacier.

- Our walk takes us through stunning nature to the **Briksdal Glacier**, a branch of the mighty **Jostedalsglacier**, the largest in Europe.
- At first, the path climbs and crosses over the waterfall on a wooden bridge.
- At this point we find ourselves standing face to face with the massive glacier.
- We'll then walk back the same way to the mountain lodge, where we'll enjoy an **excellent lunch**.
- Back on our journey, we cross the valley alongside the extraordinarily beautiful lake towards Stryn.
- We climb the **mountain road to Stryn**, which used to link eastern Norway with the west.
- Our return journey to Geiranger runs through quite a few tunnels, and we make a final stop at **Flydal** to take a few snapshots of our ship, waiting for us in the fjord.

Geiranger **HELICOPTER TOUR OF GEIRANGERFJORD**

In a nutshell

An extraordinary helicopter experience discovering the natural wonders and beautiful landscape of Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, from a unique perspective up above. We will see its picture-postcard scenery: majestic snow-capped mountains, rugged cliffs, cascading waterfalls, and small colourful farms nestled in the lush vegetation. An unmissable tour for nature lovers and more!

Main stops

- Helicopter flight over Geirangerfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Breathtaking views of the surrounding snow-capped mountains
- Mount Dalsnibba, rugged cliffs, waterfalls, farms, glaciers

The programme

- We will take to the skies for this excursion on a **helicopter ride** and soar over **one of the most famous and spectacular fjords** in Norway: **Geirangerfjord**, declared a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** in 2005.
- We will cover the full length of the fjord, around 15 km, starting at sea level and rising to the summit

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of the **surrounding snow-capped mountains**: we will be amazed by the **breathtaking views and steep, rugged cliffs** with powerful **waterfalls** (such as the "Seven Sisters" or "Bridal Veil Falls"), which create light veils of mist that produce an endless display of ever-changing rainbows, which will leave us lost for words.

- We will fly to **Mount Dalsnibba**, 1500 metres high, which towers over the tourist town of Geiranger, located at the end of the fjord. We will be able to see **small farms** from up here, nestled in the foothills of the mountains, and higher up **glaciers** with ice caves and small icy waterfalls.
- As we fly back along the fjord to return to base, we will notice the lush vegetation beneath us, a fundamental part of this wild and exciting natural landscape.
- The flight lasts approximately 30 minutes.
- The flight, landing and routes may be subject to change depending on weather conditions and are at the pilot's discretion.
- The flight times are indicative and include landing.

GEIRANGERFJORD & TROLLSTIGEN: ENDLESS LANDSCAPES

In a nutshell

Fjords, mountains and landscapes that are truly unique: get ready to experience pure Norway. You'll start from **Hellesylt** and stop off at the most spectacular viewpoints of the **Geirangerfjord**, then go up **Mount Stranda** in a cable car with all-round panoramas of the fjords, glaciers and snow-capped mountains. From the top, you can admire the Unesco World Heritage Site Geirangerfjord, and then experience the fjord from the water, with a **ferry crossing** past waterfalls and rock faces. And the gran finale is thrilling: along the **Trollstigen** road, with its tight hairpin bends, on to the Ørnesvingen viewing platform, in front of the **Seven Sisters waterfall**. An unforgettable experience.

Main stops

- Viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord
- Stranda mountain and spectacular cable car
- Lunch at a restaurant
- Ferry ride across the fjord

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- Trollstigen (photostop)
- Ørnesvingen viewpoint and Seven Sisters waterfall
- Geiranger

The programme

- We will leave the port of Hellesylt and head north, soon making a stop at the **viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord**, where we can take photos of the breathtaking views with our cameras.
- Afterwards, we will continue to **Mount Stranda**, a renowned ski resort offering breathtaking views of the surrounding snowy peaks as well as the majestic Storfjord.
- We will leave our coach behind us and climb to the top on a **spectacular cable car** whose large windows offer us 360° views of the fjord and mountains.
- The cable car runs to 1042 metres above sea level, where we can feel in **direct contact with nature** as we see goats grazing in summer and plenty of snow for the kids to play in.
- From the top of the mountain we can enjoy **exceptional views** of the majestic Geirangerfjord, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Jostedal glacier, the largest in Europe situated on dry land.
- We will then **cross the Geirangerfjord on a ferry**, marvelling at the steep, imposing mountains with their countless waterfalls dropping down towards the sea.
- Our next destination is a photostop at the famous **Trollstigen** or 'Trolls' Path', an engineering feat consisting of an extremely narrow scenic road with 11 hairpin bends and a hair-raising steep gradient, surrounded by majestic mountains and stunning waterfalls.
- Back down at the fjord, we will take the ferry back across it and stop at the **Ørnesvingen viewpoint**, which literally means Eagles' Turn, where we can admire and take photos of the Geirangerfjord and the **Seven Sisters waterfall**, so called because it splits into seven rivulets over the rock face.
- Then we will travel along the last section of the road and stop in **Geiranger**, our final destination.
- The excursion starts in Hellesylt and ends in Geiranger.
- For safety reasons, if Trollstigen road is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.

GEIRANGERFJORD: KAYAKING ON THE FJORD

In a nutshell

Experience the **Geirangerfjord** in the fjord itself, **paddling in a kayak** between majestic mountains, sheer drops and farms clinging to the cliff-tops. Glide silently through the water, breathe in the purest air and feel at one with some of the most spectacular scenery the world over. A slow-paced, intense and exceptional experience.

Main stops

- Geirangerfjord: breathtaking scenery and cliff-top farms

The programme

- The **Geirangerfjord** is described as the most beautiful fjord in the world: we will set off on a kayak

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journey surrounded by magnificent and striking mountains, which, with their steep faces, reach heights of up to 1,500 metres.

- Grip those paddles and away we go: we will admire the **brehtaking scenery and the farms perched on their rocky outcrops**. According to local folklore, farmers would tie ropes to their children and animals to prevent them from falling from the high walls of rock. We will skim the waters and breathe in the extremely fresh air of the fjord: what better way to feel the strength and greatness of mother nature in person than on a kayak tour?
- Our kayak will follow the outline of the basin, which curves between two tower-shaped mountains. It is a magical and majestic place at any time of the year.
- After admiring the verdant nature and the striking rock formations of the fjord, we will set off on the return journey, during which our guide will tell us the history of Geiranger and its population.
- You must be physically fit to take part in this excursion and not suffer from back pain.
- You must be able to swim.
- No prior kayak experience is required.
- The excursion includes a 5 minute walk to the kayak platform, where participants will receive safety instructions and information on how to paddle.
- Minimum age for the kayak excursion with an adult: 12 yrs.
- Maximum weight: 120 kg.
- Maximum height: 190 cm.

- From Hellesylt we follow the course of the **river Bygdeelva** and head towards the Vollster farm, which sits approximately 250 metres above sea level.
- From here we proceed on foot.
- Along the path we will see **three seter (traditional mountain farm huts) and numerous mountain lakes**, reaching a maximum altitude of 550 metres above sea level
- During the climb we will make a brief stop to admire the **Stryn lake**, which reflects the imposing mountains of Skåla and Lofjellet and several smaller glaciers.
- We then descend down the path in the direction of **Flo, an enchanting village sprinkled with fruit trees**.
- Here we will board the coach once more and continue our trip along the banks of the 15 km-long **Stryn lake**, which is famous for its turquoise reflections. The new Stryn mountain road passes through several tunnels making it accessible even during the winter season.

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- Having reached the shore **opposite the mountains**, we continue west along the banks of lake Djupvatn. At its furthest point, we turn and take a steep toll road to reach the **panoramic view point of Dalsnibba**.
- Having admired the **unforgettable landscape** that the observation point offers us, we descend to Geiranger, making a **stop for photos at the Flydal Gorge**.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- We recommend you wear sturdy shoes that are suitable for walking.
- We recommend that you bring a wind-proof jacket as the mountain air can be cold even on a sunny day.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- For safety reasons, if the road to Mount Dalsnibba is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.
- Participants will rejoin the ship at Geiranger.

Afterwards, the descent will take you to **Brosundet**, the harbor district with its fishing boats and real-life scenes, and the location of the **historic Molja lighthouse**. Then on through **Hellebroa** to reach **Brunholmen**, with its perfect combination of historic architecture and a contemporary atmosphere.

A few bends, along cobbled streets, a handful of scenic views and: you're back at the ship with at least a hundred new photos, knowing that going up Mount Aksla on the tourist train was one of the best ideas of the day.

ALL OF ALESUND ON FOOT: VISTING VINTAGE MUSEUMS AND VIKING ATTRACTIONS

In a nutshell

Discover **Ålesund**, the Norwegian town built on islands jutting out into the Atlantic ocean, surrounded by stunning mountains. Rebuilt after a devastating fire in 1904 in an **Art Nouveau** style, Ålesund is a true gem, elegant and easy to visit on foot. With vintage museums, viking statues, the **Park at the foot of Mount Aksla** and breathtaking views, the tour gives you a chance to explore the history, architecture and seafaring traditions of a unique town.

Main stops

- Art Nouveau Centre
- Art Nouveau in town
- Park at the foot of Mount Aksla: commemorative stone to William II and the statue of the Viking warrior "Gange-Rolv"

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The programme

- Let's discover Ålesund, the largest town on the north-west coast of Norway, built on islands extending into the ocean which stand out against the splendid backdrop of impressive mountain peaks..
- A large part of the town was destroyed by the fire of 1904. It was rebuilt in the typical Art Nouveau style of the first decade of the twentieth century .
- It was the German Emperor William II, a great friend of the Norwegian kings, who used to spend his holidays in district of Sunnmøre, to send four ships laden with help for the town. The central nucleus was rebuilt in bricks and stone to restrict any further fires.
- Today, Ålesund has a population of about 66,000, although the town centre is relatively small and is easy to visit on foot.
- Our tour begins with a visit to the **Art Nouveau Centre**, a museum in one of the most beautifully decorated buildings in this style: it used to be a pharmacy and inside it still houses the vintage containers of herbs and medicines on its shelves.
- The three-storey museum provides an interesting overview of the history of Ålesund, of the fire in 1904 and of the creative period in the Art Nouveau style.
- During our journey, we will be told of the importance of the fishmongers in Norway's largest port for the export of fish. We'll have the opportunity of seeing various examples of the **Art Nouveau style of the town's architecture**, which has made Ålesund famous as one of the last three Art Nouveau towns in Europe.,
- Our excursion continues to climb up to the small **park at the foot of Mount Aksla**.
- We'll see numerous **plants** in the park as well as a commemorative stone dedicated to the emperor William II for the help he gave to the town after the fire of 1904. Here stands the **statue of the Viking warrior Ragnvald** who sailed from Ålesund to today's Normandy, the name of which comes from the Norwegian conquerors.
- We can walk round the park and take a break before returning to the quayside and to our ship.
- Guests must be able to walk for approximately 3 km on steep, asphalted and cobbled terrain.
- Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

- The city was founded in 1793 and extends from west to east over three small islands facing the Norwegian Sea. After a fire destroyed the old wooden houses and left over 10,000 people homeless, it was entirely rebuilt in 1904 in Art Nouveau style by Norwegian architects inspired by the European style.
- Following the itinerary along the **Borgundfjord**, we go past **modern districts** and the **old commercial centre**.
- Then we will really venture into the past with a visit to the **Sunnmøre Museum**, an open-air museum located in a fascinating setting, home to 30 original **ancient houses** from different parts of the country. The museum reproduces traditional local scenes, and houses a **craft collection**, allowing us to retrace the history, traditions and customs of this seafaring culture. For nautical enthusiasts, there is also a collection of around 40 ancient boats, including reconstructions of Viking ships and a merchant vessel dating back to approximately 1000 AD.

Giske is known as the "saga island" because the Viking chieftain, Rollo, an ancestor of William the Conqueror, was born here and later settled on the northern coast of France known today as Normandy. Settlements on the flat and fertile island of Giske date back to the beginning of the Bronze Age.
- Next we will visit **Giske church**, built in 1150; the inner and outer walls are covered with white marble. It was originally a family chapel belonging to the powerful Giske clan. The church boasts a multi-coloured altarpiece and a finely carved pulpit.
- Then we travel to the second island on our tour, the **island of Godøy**, where we will visit the **lighthouse**, dating back to 1876, situated in the small **fishing village of Alnes** overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. To truly appreciate the sense of isolation here, visitors who wish to do so can climb the stairs up the five floors of the wooden structure which lead to the top of the lighthouse, up to the circular balcony.
- We recommend wearing comfortable shoes.

Situated 67 km south-west of Ålesund and connected to the mainland via a bridge, the island is home to over half a million seabirds of 230 different species, including 100,000 puffins and 50,000 pairs of kittiwakes, as well as colonies of gannets, petrels, razorbills and guillemots which nest there.
- In the event of less favourable conditions, we will stay in the sheltered waters of Ålesund. There are also many birds here and, with a bit of luck, we may even get to catch a glimpse of an eagle ray.
- Our guide will help us to spot some interesting examples of the **local fauna** and will take us near a rock where we can watch the **seals** basking in the sun.
- A maximum of 12 guests per departure is permitted.
- You must be physically fit to take part in this excursion and not suffer from back pain.
- In order to participate guests must be able to swim.
- If the ship is docked, there are approximately 300 metres to cover on foot from the dock to the RIB embarkation point. If the ship is docked, the tenders use the same dock as the RIBs.

Large salted water pools are lined up along the coast, providing us with the opportunity to get to know the underwater world of the northern Atlantic. Through a transparent 18 metre panel, we can see the sea life within the largest of the pools, which holds 4 million litres of water.
- Then we will travel to the island of Godøy, with its unique structure, almost divided into two by a mountain range.
- Here, we will visit the **lighthouse** from 1876 located in the small **fishing village of Alnes** overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. To truly appreciate the sense of isolation here, visitors who wish to do so can climb the stairs up the five floors of the wooden structure which lead to the top of the lighthouse, up to the circular balcony. Every floor features paintings created by the famous Norwegian artist, Ørnulf Opdahl.
- Return through the **island of Giske**, one of the many islands that make up the archipelago of the same name, where the inhabitants (around 6,300) rely on ferry links to Ålesund and the mainland. The islands can be reached over bridges and through underground tunnels, the longest of which is 4.2 km long.
- The legendary island of Giske is also known as the "saga island" because the Viking chieftain, Rollo, an ancestor of William the Conqueror, was born here and later settled on the northern coast of France known today as Normandy. Settlements on the flat and fertile island of Giske date back to the beginning of the Bronze Age.
- On the return journey, we can admire some elegant details of the Art Nouveau architecture before

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heading to the suburbs with the fascinating wood villas and the well-kept gardens.

- The itinerary may be subject to change.
- Please note that on 03th September it will be not allowed to visit Giske church due to a wedding.
The church will be visible from the bus

- The view will leave you speechless: green fields, goats grazing and snow that is even still there in summer - perfect for the kids who can have fun playing. From the **viewpoint at the top of the mountain**, we can admire the majestic Geiranger Fjord, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Jostedal glacier, the largest in Europe situated on dry land.
- We will have a bit of free time to relax and enjoy the atmosphere up on the mountain taking in the stunning panoramic views.
- For the return back to Ålesund we will cross the fjord again, taking a different route from before and take a ferry.
- Stranda Gondola might close for safety reasons in case of high winds or adverse weather conditions. In this case we will do our best to provide an alternative program.

- Leaving the city, we will travel east towards the little **village of Sjøholt**, where the fjord becomes a cove and spills out towards the south.
- The road continues alongside the **majestic Storfjord**, which brightens up our journey with picture-postcard scenery. This region is famous for salmon fishing and the manufacture of furniture. Our first stop, the **little town of Stordal**, is home to a number of furniture manufacturers and a charming **octagonal church** built in 1789, which we will admire as we pass.
- Our journey will continue through the **villages of Liabygda and Vallidal**, famous for producing sweet strawberries, and we will delve deeper and deeper into the heart of the fjord's mazes.
- We will leave the stretch of sea behind us and follow the valley that scrambles up towards the mountains, passing through the imposing **Gudbrandsjuvet canyon**, one of the most famous and popular sightseeing points in the region, offering spectacular views.
- At lunchtime, we will stop to **taste some typical Norwegian dishes**. This exquisite experience of local culinary traditions will end with a delicious dessert.
- After lunch, we will head to the highest part of the road that stands 853 metres above sea level, and our coach will look out onto the famous Trollstigen or **Trolls' Path**, a breathtaking road closed to

traffic in winter which descends into Isterdalen valley with 11 incredible bends, a 12% gradient and just a single lane for almost the entire route.

- We will admire the **Troll Wall or Trollveggen**, the tallest vertical rock face in Europe (915 metres) and a popular destination in summer for climbing enthusiasts from all over the world.
- Heading back down to the sea, we will travel along the opposite side of **Romsdalsfjorden** than on our journey that morning, and we will pass through the **villages of Innfjorden, Måndalen, Vågstranda and Vikebukt** before crossing the **Ørskog mountain** region and returning to the road that will take us back towards Ålesund.
- **Due to a landslide, the Trollstigen road was closed for the entire season for safety reasons. The viewing platform will still be reachable but the road will not be accessible. Part of the itinerary of this excursion will therefore be modified (for example it will not be possible to make a stop at the Troll Wall, replaced by a stop at the Stordal Old Church and the Skodje Bridge).**

Then comes the moment you've been waiting for: **Pulpit Rock** appears all of a sudden, suspended **604 meters above Lysefjord**. The view from up here isn't just stunning: it's hypnotic.

The plane glides slowly around the rock, as if to introduce you to it. You look straight at it, and will be amazed. Photos? You won't need filters: you'll have natural light, inconceivable angles and no crowds whatsoever-

No throngs of people, no effort, no trekking for hours- Just **30 minutes of pure adrenaline**, ease and views that will most definitely leave an impression on you. And when the seaplane touches water again, you'll be certain of one thing: after seeing Pulpit rock so close up, any other experience at **Preikestolen** will be a plan B.

- From there, we will walk along a rocky mountain path to admire the stunning views dotted with small lakes. This area, which is home to a substantial population of ptarmigan, is well-known to local hunters and fishermen.
- Continuing our walking tour, we will reach the **Preikestolen (the "pulpit"rock)**, a flat rock that overlooks the Lysefjord from a height of 604 metres above sea level. From here, we can enjoy beautiful views of the surrounding mountains.
- After our visit, we will return along the same path to the Preikestolen Refuge, where our coach will be waiting to take us back to Stavanger.
- The Preikestolen area is not secure. We therefore recommend you move with caution and keep a safe distance from the cliff edge.
- The experience takes place on an uneven mountain track that also has steep sections. Accordingly, for your own safety, it is important to wear walking shoes. If you do not have any with you, they can be rented on site.
- We recommend you wear a waterproof windbreaker over your clothes.
- This outdoor excursion will take place in all weathers, with the exception of snow.
- The walk covers a distance of approximately 8 km with a difference in height of approximately 340 metres from start to finish and is only recommended for guests accustomed to walking on rough paths.

STAVANGER: VIKINGS, LANDSCAPES AND NORWEGIAN SYMBOLS

In a nutshell

From Stavanger to the origins of Norway. Visit the **Iron Age Farm at Ullandhaug**, overlooking the Hafrsfjord, cross the **countryside at Jæren** and admire the **Ryfylke mountains**. Stop in front of the iconic swords in the stone and then head back to Stavanger, its Cathedral and the alleys of the **historic center**. A tour featuring the Viking past alongside Norway's modern side.

- Ullandhaug & Iron age farm
- Jæren landscape
- Ryfylke Mountains
- Sverd i fjell (the "Swords in Rock")
- Stavanger Cathedral (outside visit)
- Old Stavanger

The programme

- We will set off from the port by coach through **Ullandhaug**, an area famous for its reconstructions of Iron Age farms. Ullandhaug also boasts breath-taking views of the **Hafrsfjord** where, in 872, the Viking king Harald Fairhair defeated the last of the local princes and unified 29 small kingdoms under one crown, founding the Kingdom of Norway. To the east stretches the fertile **landscape of Jæren**, with the **Ryfylke Mountains** in the distance.
- We will then continue to the outskirts of Stavanger to admire the **Sverd i fjell ("Swords in Rock")**, a fascinating memorial by the sculptor Fritz Røed. The monument depicts three 10 metre-high swords that commemorate the historic battle of Hafrsfjord. The largest sword represents the victorious Harald, while the smaller ones symbolise the vanquished kings. The monument is also intended to symbolise peace, as the swords are struck in solid rock, from which they can never be removed.
- We will now pass through both the older and more modern districts of Stavanger; we will admire the outside of the **Cathedral**, built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester with the help of

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British craftsmen. Of all the churches built in Norway during the Middle Ages, Stavanger Cathedral is the only one that still retains its original features.

- Before returning to the ship, we will treat ourselves to a walk through "Old Stavanger", with its typical narrow streets lined with picturesque wooden houses that date back to the 18th and 19th centuries, a time when it was home to sailors, craftsmen and merchants. This unique area, located just a few minutes from the port, is now at the centre of the city's most ambitious redevelopment project.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- The Cathedral is currently under renovation, so the visit will be from outside.

- On leaving the square, we will continue to the **Cathedral** for an outside visit Dedicated to St. Svithun, patron saint of the city, and built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester, with the help of British craftsmen, Stavanger Cathedral is the best-preserved medieval church in Norway, second only to the Nidaros Cathedral in Trondheim.
- After admiring the cathedral, we will return to the port.

KIEL AND LABOE: CANALS, SAILORS AND SUBMARINES – the tour ends at the airport

- Our visit to the memorial is over and we set off by coach for Hamburg airport.

- Next stop on the tour is the home of the Queen, **Amalienborg Palace**: four identical buildings, guarded by soldiers in traditional bearskin hats. In the palace grounds, the **statue of King Frederick V**, on horseback depicted as a Roman emperor, is considered one of the most important equestrian statues in the world.
- Next on our itinerary is **Christiansborg Palace** on the islet of Slotsholmen, which, being home to Denmark's most important institutions, is fittingly nicknamed the "Island of Power".
