- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

- The walk to the waterfall takes around 1 hour (3 km) and covers rough ground and steep sections so it may be tiring.
- We recommend wearing walking shoes and suitable clothing.

BRIKSDAL GLACIER WALK

Description

Have you ever seen a glacier? This is exactly what we'll be doing on this tour - and not just on any glacier either: the Briksdal, a spectacular expanse of ice hidden among the magnificent Norwegian fjords.

What we will see

- Village of Hellesylt and Hellesylt waterfall
- Lake Hornindalsvanet
- Nordfjord, villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden
- Briksdal Glacier and spectacular nature
- Mountain lodge near the glacier with a stop for lunch
- Road to Stryn, return trip via Geiranger, tunnels and panoramic viewpoint at Flydal Gorge





What we will do

- Our excursion begins in the **village of Hellesylt** , where we can admire the majestic **waterfall** of the same name, whose waters cascade down to the shimmering emerald green and ultramarine blue fjord below.
- We continue our journey towards **Hornindalsvanet** which, at a depth of 514 metres, can claim to be Europe's deepest lake; before us lies the magnificent **Nordfjord** , alongside the road through the villages of Stryn, Loen and Olden. This fascinating village nestles at the bottom of the fjord and stretches along numerous lakes in the Olden Valley as far as the mountain lodge at the Briksdal Glacier.
- Our walk takes us through stunning nature to the **Briksdal Glacier** , a branch of the mighty **Jostedalbreen Glacier** , the largest in Europe.
- At first, the path climbs and crosses over the waterfall on a wooden bridge.
- At this point we find ourselves standing face to face with the massive glacier.
- We'll then walk back the same way to the mountain lodge, where we'll enjoy an **excellent lunch**.
- Back on our journey, we cross the valley alongside the extraordinarily beautiful lake towards Stryn.
- We climb the **mountain road to Stryn** , which used to link eastern Norway with the west.
- Our return journey to Geiranger runs through quite a few tunnels, and we make a final stop at **Flydal** to take a few snapshots of our ship, waiting for us in the fjord.

FROM MOUNTAINTOP TO FJORD BY BIKE
Description

The perfect excursion for bike enthusiasts: a downhill biking tour with spectacular views of waterfalls and mountains as well as a hint of adrenaline for an unforgettable experience.





What we will see

- Djupvasshytta, Dalsnibba Mountain
- Downhill Biking Tour: scenic points, spectacular view of the Geirangerfjord

What we will do

- We will depart by coach from the Geiranger lifeboat station and head to **Djupvasshytta**, which sits at an altitude of 1,030 metres, at the foot of the **Dalsnibba Mountain**. This marks the departure point for our thrilling, 17-km **Downhill Bicycle Tour**.
- Everybody will be provided with a bicycle, but before getting in the saddle and beginning our descent to the valley, the guide will provide instructions and information on safety and the signposting along the route.
- On route, we will find many points from which we can take photos or simply admire the incredible scenery that the **Geirangerfjord**, a UNESCO-protected site, has to offer.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- We recommend wearing sports clothing.
- You need to be physically fit to take part in this excursion.
- The safety helmet provided must be worn during the excursion.
- Minimum age: 12.

OVERLAND: FROM STRANDA TO TROLLSTIGEN
Description

We will explore the awe-inspiring Norwegian landscape visiting several destinations along the spectacular Geirangerfjord, taking a cable car up to the top of the famous Stranda mountain, where we will have lunch in a restaurant with panoramic views, and we will cross the fjord on a boat and travel along one of the steepest and most thrilling roads in the world.

What we will see

- Viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord
- Stranda mountain and spectacular cable car
- Lunch at a restaurant with panoramic views
- Ferry ride across the fjord
- Trollstigen
- Ørnesvingen viewpoint and Seven Sisters waterfall
- Geiranger

What we will do

- We will leave the port of Hellesylt and head north, soon making a stop at the **viewpoint over the Geirangerfjord**, where we can take photos of the breathtaking views with our cameras.
- Afterwards, we will continue to **Mount Stranda**, a renowned ski resort offering breathtaking views of the surrounding snowy peaks as well as the majestic Storfjord.
- We will leave our coach behind us and climb to the top on a **spectacular cable car** whose large windows offer us 360° views of the fjord and mountains.
- The cable car runs to 1042 metres above sea level, where we can feel in **direct contact with nature** as we see goats grazing in summer and plenty of snow for the kids to play in.
- From the top of the mountain we can enjoy **exceptional views** of the majestic Geirangerfjord, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Jostedal glacier, the largest in Europe situated on dry land.
- After enjoying some free time, we will sit down for **lunch in a restaurant with panoramic views** at the top of the mountain before we head back down on the cable car.
- We will then **cross the Geirangerfjord on a ferry**, marvelling at the steep, imposing mountains with their countless waterfalls dropping down towards the sea.
- Our next destination is the famous **Trollstigen** or 'Trolls' Path', an engineering feat consisting of an extremely narrow scenic road with 11 hairpin bends and a hair-raising steep gradient, surrounded by majestic mountains and stunning waterfalls.
- Back down at the fjord, we will take the ferry back across it and stop at the **Ørnesvingen viewpoint**, which literally means Eagles' Turn, where we can admire and take photos of the Geirangerfjord and the **Seven Sisters waterfall**, so called because it splits into seven rivulets over the rock face.
- Then we will travel along the last section of the road and stop in **Geiranger**, our final destination.
- The excursion starts in Hellesylt and ends in Geiranger.

HIGH END KAYAKING



Description

Discover the Geirangerfjord paddling in the true heart of the norwegian fjords, one of the most beautiful and suggestive places of Scandinavia.

What we will see

- Geirangerfjord: breathtaking scenery and clifftop farms

What we will do

- The **Geirangerfjord** is described as the most beautiful fjord in the world: we will set off on a kayak journey surrounded by magnificent and striking mountains, which, with their steep faces, reach heights of up to 1,500 metres.
- Grip those paddles and away we go: we will admire the **breathtaking scenery and the farms perched on their rocky outcrops**. According to local folklore, farmers would tie ropes to their children and animals to prevent them from falling from the high walls of rock. We will skim the waters and breathe in the extremely fresh air of the fjord: what better way to feel the strength and greatness of mother nature in person than on a kayak tour?
- Our kayak will follow the outline of the basin, which curves between two tower-shaped mountains. It is a magical and majestic place at any time of the year.
- After admiring the verdant nature and the striking rock formations of the fjord, we will set off on the return journey, during which our guide will tell us the history of Geiranger and its population.
- You must be physically fit to take part in this excursion and not suffer from back pain.
- You must be able to swim.
- No prior kayak experience is required.
- The excursion includes a 5 minute walk to the kayak platform, where participants will receive safety instructions and information on how to paddle.
- Minimum age for the kayak excursion with an adult: 8.
- Maximum weight: 120 kg.
- Maximum height: 190 cm.
- Minors under 12 years of age must share the kayak with an adult.
- It is recommended that you only bring personal belongings which are strictly necessary; belongings will be left in a locked local office.
- Guests under 18 years must have the waiver signed by an adult (parent or guardian).

Description

A full immersion in the unspoilt nature of Geirangerfjord, protected site by UNESCO, admiring the best of Western-Norway and a breathtaking views of mountains, waterfalls, fjords and valleys.

What we will see

- Village of Geiranger
- Scenic view of the village and the Geirangerfjord
- Lake Djupvatn and Dalsnibba Mountain: mountains, glaciers, waterfalls and lakes
- Djupvasshytta: free time

What we will do

- Our tour begins in the **pleasant village of Geiranger** and will continue to the top of the mountain along the extremely steep Geiranger road.
- During the journey, we stop to enjoy a marvellous **scenic view** of the village of Geiranger below, the famous fjord and surrounding mountains. Verdant and unspoilt countryside as far as the eye can see.
- We continue on to **Lake Djupvatn**, then take the road to the top of **Dalsnibba Mountain** (1,500 m).
- If there is enough time, we can again enjoy a view of the **breathtaking landscape of mountains, glaciers, waterfalls and lakes**.
- We make a stop at **Djupvasshytta**, where we will have some **free time** to go looking for souvenirs and take photos of the lake to take home as lovely memories.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- For safety reasons, if the road to Mount Dalsnibba is closed or covered by snow, an alternative panoramic view point will be suggested depending on weather conditions.

THE HERDAL VALLEY, ALPINE FARM AND TASTING OF LOCAL SPECIALITIES

Description

A perfect excursion for those wishing to combine the splendid countryside of the fjord and the discovery of local traditions and lifestyle, tasting typical products of the alpine farm located at the heart of the fjord: an unforgettable journey.

What we will see

- Ørnevegen: views of the fjord and the Knivsflå alpine farm
- Seven Sisters Waterfall and Suitor Waterfall
- Village of Eidsdal and the village of Norddal
- Summer farm of Herdalssetra: unspoilt nature, grazing animals and local specialities
- Heregga Peak: wood houses with turf roofs
- Herdøla River

What we will do

- The excursion begins on the **Ørnevegen** (literally, "Eagle Road"), which rises via 11 hairpin bends to the highest point of the fjord, at a height of 620 metres. From here, we can enjoy the **spectacular scenery of the fjord and the Knivsflå alpine farm**. This is the steepest section of road out of Geiranger and is the only means of communication with the outside world during winter!
- From here, it is possible to get a glance of the **Seven Sisters, a group of 7 waterfalls** which, together with the **Suitor Waterfall** (located opposite on the other side), provide one of the most beautiful natural spectacles of all of the Norwegian fjords... as well as being the subject of a fascinating legend.
- We reach the **village of Eidsdal** in Norddalsfjord and follow the coast up to the **village of Norddal**.
- Leaving the fjord, we head into the valley until we arrive at the **summer farm of Herdalssetra**. Operational for over 300 years, it is formed of 30 old houses and for hundreds of years, has housed goats and cows, lambs and horses which are free to graze. Here, old traditions are more alive than ever. Various types of white and brown goat's cheeses are produced here, as well as other mountain delicacies typical of the Norwegian fjords. These form the basis of a special **tasting session**, which is sure to delight the palate.
- The dwellings we will see are small **wood houses with turf roofs**, purposely built under the large **Heregga Peak**, which protects them from the frequent avalanches .
- On the journey to the valley, we can admire the **Herdøla River**, which receives the waters from numerous waterfalls.
- We arrive in Eidsdal then return to Geiranger via, once again, Ørnevegen, the "Eagle Road".

RAFT TOUR OF THE GEIRANGER FJORD

Description

The perfect combination of breathtaking scenery, traditional landscapes and a little adrenaline, when gliding along the waters, in a raft, of the majestic fjord of Geiranger: on this excursion, we will discover one of the most magical places in Scandinavia, right from its very waters.

What we will see

- Geirangerfjord: spectacular landscapes amongst majestic mountains and unspoilt scenery
- Traditional mountain farms
- Seven Sisters Waterfall and Bridal Veil Falls

What we will do

- Our tour begins at the port: we will be welcomed by our guide and will walk approximately 200 metres to our raft.
- Before setting off on this stirring excursion on the waters of the fjord, we prepare ourselves by listening to some brief safety instructions and we put on the windproof and waterproof coverall provided.
- Now the real excitement begins: our **Geirangerfjord** adventure can begin!
- The raft goes increasingly fast and the extremely pure air of the fjord can be felt on our faces providing a great sense of freedom whilst we admire the **majestic landscape**.
- Our helmsman will amaze us with a host of spectacular manoeuvres injecting a little adrenaline to the experience. The raft journey is not just about speed: the helmsman will slow down when approaching some **small mountain farms** located along the Geirangerfjord and will tell us a little bit about their history in English.
- We will admire the **Seven Sisters Waterfall and Bridal Veil Falls** up close, two of Norway's most important waterfalls, and we will discover the legend that lies behind their names. An unforgettable experience!

What we will see

What we will do

- Our excursion starts at **Vollset**, taking us all the way to **Flo** along one of the main roads once used for commerce between Sunnmøre, the Nordfjord and the eastern regions, between the coastal towns and those situated inland, starting in the Middle Ages. Goods were carried on one's shoulder or on horseback as the atmospheric conditions meant that the paths were almost impassable and alternative forms of transport could not be trusted.
- From Hellesylt we follow the course of the **river Bygdeelva** and head towards the Vollster farm, which sits approximately 250 metres above sea level.
- From here we proceed on foot.
- Along the path we will see **three seter (traditional mountain farm huts) and numerous mountain lakes**, reaching a maximum altitude of 550 metres above sea level
- During the climb we will make a brief stop to admire the **Stryn lake**, which reflects the imposing mountains of Skåla and Lofjellet and several smaller glaciers.
- We then descend down the path in the direction of **Flo, an enchanting village sprinkled with fruit trees**.
- Here we will board the coach once more and continue our trip along the banks of the 15 km-long **Stryn lake**, which is famous for its turquoise reflections. The new Stryn mountain road passes through several tunnels making it accessible even during the winter season.
- Having reached the shore **opposite the mountains**, we continue west along the banks of lake Djupvatn. At its furthest point, we turn and take a steep toll road to reach the **panoramic view point of Dalsnibba**.
- Having admired the **unforgettable landscape** that the observation point offers us, we descend to Geiranger, making a **stop for photos at the Flydal Gorge**.

ÅLESUND TOUR

Description

A complete tour of Ålesund, one of the busiest fishing ports in Norway. We will discover the history and cultural traditions of this seaside town, not forgetting its nature with a stop at spectacular Mount Aksla.

What we will see

- Ålesund: Borgundfjord, modern districts and old commercial centre, Sunnmøre Museum with ancient houses and craft collections
- Mount Aksla

What we will do

- We depart with our guide and head for **Ålesund**, the most famous fishing port in Norway for deep-sea fishing and herring and cod processing.
- The city was founded in 1793 and extends from west to east over three small islands facing the Norwegian Sea. After a fire destroyed the old wooden houses and left over 10,000 people homeless, it was entirely rebuilt in 1904 in Art Nouveau style by Norwegian architects inspired by the European style.
- Following the itinerary along the **Borgundfjord**, we go past **modern districts** and the **old commercial centre**.
- Then we will really venture into the past with a visit to the **Sunnmøre Museum**, an open-air museum located in a fascinating setting, home to 30 original **ancient houses** from different parts of the country. The museum reproduces traditional local scenes, and houses a **craft collection**, allowing us to retrace the history, traditions and customs of this seafaring culture. For nautical enthusiasts, there is also a collection of around 40 ancient boats, including reconstructions of Viking ships and a merchant vessel dating back to approximately 1000 AD.

EXCURSION TO THE ISLANDS OF GISKE AND GODØY

Description

An unmissable excursion to the islands of Giske and Godøy, to step back in time and discover the events and traditions of Viking culture and the clans that populated this incredible archipelago centuries ago.

What we will see

- Island of Giske: Giske church
- Island of Godøy: lighthouse in the village of Alnes
- Mount Aksla: panoramic viewpoint

What we will do

- We start our excursion on the **island of Giske**, one of the many islands that make up the archipelago of the same name, where the inhabitants (around 6,300) rely on ferry links to Ålesund and the mainland. The islands can be reached over bridges and through underground tunnels, the longest of which is 4.2 km long.
- The legendary island of Giske enjoyed a particularly privileged position in the Viking era and was home to some of the most important Norwegian families. Giske is known as the "saga island" because the Viking chieftain, Rollo, an ancestor of William the Conqueror, was born here and later settled on the northern coast of France known today as Normandy. Settlements on the flat and fertile island of Giske date back to the beginning of the Bronze Age.
- Next we will visit **Giske church**, built in 1150; the inner and outer walls are covered with white marble. It was originally a family chapel belonging to the powerful Giske clan. The church boasts a multi-coloured altarpiece and a finely carved pulpit.
- Then we travel to the second island on our tour, the **island of Godøy**, where we will visit the **lighthouse**, dating back to 1876, situated in the small **fishing village of Alnes** overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. To truly appreciate the sense of isolation here, visitors who wish to do so can climb the stairs up the five floors of the wooden structure which lead to the top of the lighthouse, up to the circular balcony.
- After the lighthouse visit, we will return to Ålesund via the **panoramic viewpoint of Mount Aksla** which, along with the Fjellstua and Kniven viewpoints, is one of Ålesund's biggest attractions. It boasts incredible views of the town, the charming surrounding islands and the majestic Sunnmøre Alps.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- We recommend wearing comfortable shoes.

- In the event of less favourable conditions, we will stay in the sheltered waters of Ålesund. There are also many birds here and, with a bit of luck, we may even get to catch a glimpse of an eagle ray.
- Our guide will help us to spot some interesting examples of the **local fauna** and will take us near a rock where we can watch the **seals** basking in the sun.

An exciting tour to discover Ålesund, a major Norwegian port with its history and typical Art Nouveau architecture, but also an unusual Aquarium with an infinite variety of marine fauna, all wrapped in a colourful, fairytale atmosphere with spectacular scenery.

What we will see

- Visit to the aquarium in Ålesund: marine fauna and habitat of Norway
- Art Nouveau architectural style in Ålesund
- Panoramic view of Mount Aksla

What we will do

- Let's discover Ålesund, the largest town on the north-west coast of Norway, built on numerous islands extending into the ocean. The picturesque fishing port of Ålesund is one of the busiest in Norway, and is still acknowledged as the Norwegian capital of fish.
- A large part of the town was destroyed by the fire of 1904. It was rebuilt in the typical, twentieth century "Art Nouveau style".
- It was the German Emperor William II, a great friend of the Norwegian kings, who used to spend his holidays in district of Sunnmøre, to actually send four ships laden with help for the town. The central nucleus was rebuilt in bricks and stone to restrict any further fires.
- Today, Ålesund has a population of about 40,000, although the town centre is relatively small and is easy to visit on foot.
- The main source of income of this lively town comes from the fishing and furniture industries.
- Our excursion will include a visit to the Norway's, and indeed Europe's unique **Ålesund Aquarium**.
- This water park is highly recommended for children from an educational point of view, as it reproduces the **marine fauna and habitat of Norway** and the climates of the north. A wide range of marine life is displayed in numerous, large tanks and there are also some tactile tanks where you can touch some harmless species of fish. Outside there are large seal and penguin tanks overlooking the islands off the shores of Ålesund.
- The largest tank contains 4 million litres of water and you can watch the sea life through a transparent, 18 m-long, 4 m-high and 26,5 cm-thick panel.
- On our return journey, you'll have the opportunity to admire some of the sophisticated details of the **Art Nouveau architecture** and dive into the past, especially in the pedestrian area. We'll continue towards the suburbs of Ålesund, with their fascinating wooden villas and carefully tended gardens, before we go up **Mount Aksia**. Along with the Fjellstua and Kniven viewpoints, Mount Aksla is one of Ålesund's biggest attractions. It boasts incredible views of the town, the charming, surrounding islands and the majestic Sunnmøre Alps.

- We'll **stop briefly** to admire the **splendid panorama** towards the ocean and the numerous islands of the archipelago before ending our tour at the quayside.

An exciting tour to discover Ålesund, a major Norwegian port with its history and typical Art Nouveau architecture, with a visit to the museum and not forgetting the landscape and nature of Mount Aksia and its park.

What we will see

- Art Nouveau Centre
- Art Nouveau in town
- Park at the foot of Mount Aksla: exotic plants, a commemorative stone to William II and the statue of the Viking warrior "Gange-Rolv"
- Panoramic view of Mount Aksla

What we will do

- Let's discover Ålesund, the largest town on the north-west coast of Norway, built on three islands extending into the ocean which stand out against the splendid backdrop of impressive mountain peaks..
- A large part of the town was destroyed by the fire of 1904. It was rebuilt in the typical Art Nouveau style of the first decade of the twentieth century .
- It was the German Emperor William II, a great friend of the Norwegian kings, who used to spend his holidays in district of Sunnmøre, to actually send four ships laden with help for the town. The central nucleus was rebuilt in bricks and stone to restrict any further fires.
- Today, Ålesund has a population of about 40,000, although the town centre is relatively small and is easy to visit on foot.
- Our tour begins with a visit to the **Art Nouveau Centre**, a museum in one of the most beautifully decorated buildings in this style: it used to be a pharmacy and inside it still houses the vintage containers of herbs and medicines on its shelves.

- The three-storey museum provides an interesting overview of the history of Ålesund, of the fire in 1904 and of the creative period in the Art Nouveau style.
- During our journey, we will be told of the importance of the fishmongers in Norway's largest port for the export of fish. We'll have the opportunity of seeing various examples of the **Art Nouveau style of the town's architecture**, which has made Ålesund famous as one of the last three "Art Nouveau" towns in Europe.,
- Our excursion continues to climb up to the small **park at the foot of Mount Aksla**.
- We'll see numerous **exotic plants** in the park as well as a commemorative stone dedicated to the emperor William II for the help he gave to rebuild the town after the fire of 1904. Here stands the **statue of the Viking warrior "Gange-Rolv"**, who sailed from Ålesund to today's Normandy, the name of which comes from the Norwegian conquerors.
- After several bends, we reach Mount Aksla, where we can enjoy a **splendid panorama** towards the ocean and the numerous islands of the archipelago, or wander round the park and take a break before returning to the quayside and to our ship.
- Guests must be able to walk for approximately 3 km on steep, asphalted and cobbled terrain.
- Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

To truly appreciate the sense of isolation here, visitors who wish to do so can climb the stairs up the five floors of the wooden structure which lead to the top of the lighthouse, up to the circular balcony. Every floor features paintings created by the famous Norwegian artist, Ørnulf Opdahl.
- Before returning on-board, we will visit the **Ålesund Aquarium**, one of the most characteristic in Europe. Large salted water pools are lined up along the coast, providing us with the opportunity to get to know the underwater world of the northern Atlantic. Through a transparent 18 metre panel, we can see the sea life within the largest of the pools, which holds 4 million litres of water.
- On the return journey, we can admire some elegant details of the Art Nouveau architecture before heading to the suburbs with the fascinating wood villas and the well-kept gardens, heading directly to the **Mount Aksla viewpoint**. We will stop here to admire the spectacular view of the city, the magical surrounding islands and the majestic Sunnmøre Alps before returning to the port.

- Our climb, which lasts about an hour, takes us 50 metres above sea level right up to a height of 304 metres from the top, from where we can enjoy breathtaking views.
- We will enjoy an incredible view of the city of Ålesund and the spectacular Borgundfjord, right up to the charming Sunnmøre Alps. We will be left astounded by the landscapes which extend to the open sea and surrounding islands.
- At the end of the tour, won over by the majestic beauty of the Norwegian fjords, the coach awaits to take us on a comfortable journey back to the port.

- Our journey will continue through the **villages of Liabygda and Valldal**, famous for producing sweet strawberries, and we will delve deeper and deeper into the heart of the fjord's mazes.
- We will leave the stretch of sea behind us and follow the valley that scrambles up towards the mountains, passing through the imposing **Gudbrandsjuvet canyon**, one of the most famous and popular sightseeing points in the region, offering spectacular views.
- At lunchtime, we will stop to **taste some typical Norwegian dishes** served in a buffet offering hot and cold dishes. This exquisite experience of local culinary traditions will end with a delicious dessert.

ADVENTURE ON THE PREIKESTOLEN, THE "PULPIT" ROCK HIGH ABOVE THE FJORDS
Description

An adventurous excursion that takes us from the port of Stavanger into the heart of Norway to visit the Preikestolen, the vertiginous "pulpit rock" that overlooks the Lysefjord from on high, treating us to views that are nothing short of breath-taking.


What we will see

- Stavanger
- Petroleum Museum
- Ferry crossing on Hidlefjorden
- Tau
- Jørpeland village
- Isefjord
- Preikestolen Refuge
- Hike towards the Preikestolen
- Lysefjord

What we will do

- We will skirt the port of **Stavanger** by coach, giving us the opportunity to admire the new **Petroleum Museum**. Stavanger, the heart of the Norwegian oil industry, is the country's fourth largest city in terms of population and is located at the entrance to the Gandsfjord, sheltered from the North Sea.
- Here we will board a ferry to sail along the **Hidlefjorden** to **Tau**, located to the north east.
- We will then continue by coach through the village of **Jørpeland**, located along the **Isefjord**, to the **Preikestolen Refuge**.
- From there, we will walk along a rocky mountain path to admire the stunning views dotted with small lakes. This area, which is home to a substantial population of ptarmigan, is well-known to local hunters and fishermen.
- Continuing our walking tour, we will reach the **Preikestolen (the "pulpit"rock)**, a flat rock that overlooks the Lysefjord from a height of 604 metres above sea level. From here, we can enjoy beautiful views of the surrounding mountains.
- After our visit, we will return along the same path to the Preikestolen Refuge, where our coach will be waiting to take us back to Stavanger.

TOUR OF STAVANGER AND SURROUNDINGS

Description

Sample the history of the city of Stavanger, for centuries one of the cornerstones of Norwegian maritime history: from a time when Viking kings fought battles on the Hafstrfjord to modern-day tankers, not forgetting the age of "white sails" and steam ships. Don't miss this opportunity to visit the city and discover its many faces.

What we will see

- Ullandhaug
- Jæren landscape
- Ryfylke Mountains
- Sverd i fjell (the "Swords in Rock")
- Stavanger Cathedral
- Old Stavanger

What we will do

- We will set off from the port by coach through the lush agricultural landscape to **Ullandhaug**, an area famous for its reconstructions of Iron Age farms. Ullandhaug also boasts breath-taking views of the **Hafstrfjord** where, in 872, the Viking king Harald Fairhair defeated the last of the local princes and unified 29 small kingdoms under one crown, founding the Kingdom of Norway. To the east stretches the fertile **landscape of Jæren**, with the **Ryfylke Mountains** in the distance.
- We will then continue to the outskirts of Stavanger to admire the **Sverd i fjell ("Swords in Rock")**, a fascinating memorial by the sculptor Fritz Røed. The monument depicts three 10 metre-high swords that commemorate the historic battle of Hafstrfjord. The largest sword represents the victorious Harald, while the smaller ones symbolise the vanquished kings. The monument is also intended to symbolise peace, as the swords are struck in solid rock, from which they can never be removed.
- We will now pass through both the older and more modern districts of Stavanger; we will admire the inside of the **Cathedral**, built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester with the help of British craftsmen. Of all the churches built in Norway during the Middle Ages, Stavanger Cathedral is the only one that still retains its original features.
- Before returning to the ship, we will treat ourselves to a walk through "Old Stavanger", with its typical narrow streets lined with picturesque wooden houses that date back to the 18th and 19th centuries, a time when it was home to sailors, craftsmen and merchants. This unique area, located just a few minutes from the port, is now at the centre of the city's most ambitious redevelopment project.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- During religious functions the visit to the cathedral will only be a tour of the exterior.

A boat trip on the Lysefjord to explore some of its most remote corners. Leaving from Stavanger, we will sail up the fjord to discover its breath-taking natural landscapes, including the famous Preikestolen, the vertiginous rock formation overlooking the fjord.

What we will do

- This tour begins in **Stavanger**. The heart of the Norwegian oil industry, it is the country's fourth largest city in terms of population and is located at the entrance to the Gandsfjord, sheltered from the North Sea. Over the decades, the city has expanded to include various islands, linked to the centre by a series of bridges. In Stavanger, industrial areas and charming residential suburbs lie side by side.
- We then set sail for the **Lysefjord**, which stretches for 50 kilometres inland. During the passage, which provides stunning views of the **steep mountains** and **glaciers**, we will also be able to admire the many inhabited islands. From time to time, we may even be able to glimpse small farms dotted across the surrounding landscape.
- Continuing up to the north of the fjord, we will reach the **Preikestolen (the "pulpit" rock)**, a flat rock that overlooks the Lysefjord from a height of 604 metres above sea level. Our boat will slow down as we pass beneath it so we can marvel at this beautiful rock formation in close-up.
- As we leave the fjord, we will sail along the coast and into a narrow bay that leads to a **cave**, where thieves used to hide their loot.

- Once we have visited the Cathedral, we will take the coach to the **station with the extremely narrow railway gauges to board the 'Molli' train**. On-board the appealing **little steam train** we will pass through a magical landscape, amongst forests and small villages, until we reach **Kühlungsborn**, which since 1880 has been one of the most famous beach resorts in Germany.
- Once we arrive, we will have free time to take a walk on the **beach**, wet our feet in the fresh waters of the Baltic or simply relax seated in the typical **Strandkorb** special wooden beach chairs covered with a wicker layer used on Nordic beaches to protect from the sun but sometimes also the wind and rain.
- At the end of this pleasant excursion, we will go to one of the hotels along the coast for a coffee and a delicious slice of cake.

LUBECCA, THE JEWEL OF THE BALTICS
Description

An interesting walk along the pathways of the city's historic centre, the queen of the Hanseatic League.

What we will see

- Holstentor
- Historic centre: seven peaks, Hospital of the Holy Spirit, City Hall, 16th and 17th Century aristocratic residences, salt warehouses
- Buddenbrook House
- Niederegger Bakery, Marzipan Salon

What we will do

- We will set off from the port of Warnemünde on a panoramic journey to Lubecca, to arrive at **Holstentor**, the first stop on our excursion. We will stop here to take photographs bringing the 15th Century port to life, a symbol of the glorious past of the city, the queen of the Hanseatic League.
- The walking tour begins in the **historic centre** of the city, which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987.
- We will follow our guide amidst the alleys and courtyards to arrive in the vicinity of the **seven peaks**, which form part of the city's main churches, and continue on up until the **Hospital of the Holy Spirit**. Built in 1280, the hospital is not only one of the oldest social institutions but also represents one of the most important monumental buildings of the Middle Ages.
- We will continue our walking tour to arrive at the ancient **City Hall**, built in the 13th Century and considered one of the oldest and most magnificent in Germany.
- Of great interest are the numerous **16th and 17th Century aristocratic residences** and the **salt warehouses**.
- It would be wrong not to stop at the **House of Buddenbrook**, former home to the writers Heinrich and Thomas Mann, who were actually born in Lubecca.
- The guided tour will end at the **Marzipan Salon** of the **Niederegger Bakery**, where it is possible to admire many small sculptures and items made using this famous paste.
- We will finally have some free time to freely eat and explore the small roadways of the historic centre with the many and





elegant stores.

- The coach transfer to Lubecca takes approximately 2 hours each way.

This excursion gets straight to the point, taking us directly to the city's most iconic landmarks: the statue of the Little Mermaid, with its remarkable history, the royal residences and the Government offices.

- The second stop on our tour is **Amalienborg Palace**, comprising four identical buildings; this has been the **principal seat of the Danish royal family** since 1794. We visit the palace main square and enjoy a little free time.

The latter is located on Slotsholmen, Island, fittingly nicknamed the "Island of Power" which houses the country's main political institutions: the Parliament (Folketing), the Supreme Court and the government offices (to the south and east), as well as the state rooms of the former Royal Apartments (north wing).
