Kristiansand
A WALK THROUGH KRISTIANSAND

Description

Being the business centre of Southern Norway, Kristiansand has a long and fascinating history. This guided walking tour is the ideal way to discover Kristiansand's past and its most interesting corners.

What we will see

- Excursion on foot with a guide
- Kristiansand, fish market, cathedral, market square, Posebyen, old town district

What we will do

- Kristiansand, the capital city of the south, was nearly destroyed by bombing in 1940. With its reconstruction a new image of the city with modern, colourful buildings emerged.
- Our **guided walk** begins at the pier and we soon reach the **fish market**, where we can look around the stalls with various local seafood specialities.
- Proceeding in our tour we go past the **cathedral** and the **market square**.
- The oldest part of the city has a grid plan with streets at right angles, known in Norwegian as the **Kvadraturen**. Part of this area called **Posebyen** constitutes the longest continuous lines of low, wooden houses in Northern Europe.
- The guide tells us all about the big fire that destroyed half of the city's houses and how the locals managed to make small specialty boutiques and cafes flourish in this part of the **old borough**.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems.
- Comfortable shoes are recommended.

LINDESNES LIGHTHOUSE AND NORWAY'S SOUTH CAPE
Description

An excursion to the lighthouse at Lindesnes, the southernmost point of the Scandinavian Peninsula, which is now a museum: a charming and evocative place surrounded by a spectacular landscape.

What we will see

- Excursion by coach
- Lindesnes lighthouse, museum, guided tour, South Cape of the Scandinavian Peninsula, free time, tea and a muffin
- Coast road, Panoramic views
- Høllen, photo stop

What we will do

- Built in 1655, **Lindesnes** is Norway's oldest lighthouse. It is located at the southernmost point of the Scandinavian Peninsula, 2518 km from North Cape. The **lighthouse** has been designated a national lighthouse museum, and hosts various exhibitions related to the history and development of lighthouses and maritime culture. The view from the top of the lighthouse over the coastal landscape is simply spectacular.
- Upon arrival at the lighthouse we are greeted by the lighthouse keeper who shows us a film about the history of the building. A guide then accompanies us in a **tour of the museum** after which we have some **free time** and those who wish can climb the stairs to the top of the lighthouse. Alternatively we can sit and enjoy the spectacular view of the waves breaking on the rocks below us.
- Before boarding our coach again we are served a home baked **Lighthouse Muffin**, together with a cup of tea or coffee.
- Our return journey to Kristiansand follows a different route from the way we came, going along the **coast road**, where there are idyllic summer houses and **panoramic views** that are typical of southern Norway.
- When we arrive in **Høllen**, a small suburb of Kristiansand, we have a short **photo stop** before continuing along the scenic North Sea Road back to the ship.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

- The film at the lighthouse will be shown in English with German subtitles.
- This excursion is purely scenic and involves long coach journeys.
- It is possible to reach the top of the lighthouse by climbing a staircase with 100 steps, we recommend you wear comfortable shoes. *This excursion is not recommended for guests with mobility problems or wheelchair users.

SETESDAL AND ITS PERIOD RAILWAY
Description

A tour brimming with charm and history on genuine Norway on board a period steam train: a genuine dive into the past!

What we will see





- Journey on a steam train, coach transportation
- Vennesla, Venneslafjord lake, station of Grovane
- Setesdal railway station, Otra river, Røyknes, gully

What we will do

- A **short journey by coach** will take us into the region, where we can admire the landscape typical of this area: forests punctuated with lakes, hills and farms, here and there.
- We will arrive in **Vennesla**, a small industrial city, and continue along **Venneslafjord lake** heading for the **station of Grovane**, the railway line which connects Oslo, the capital, to Stavanger.
- The **Setesdal railway** was launched in 1896 and connected Kristiansand to the valleys of Setesdal. The line was abandoned in 1962, but an 8 km section was re-opened as a period railway.
- From Grovane, the narrow gauge railway (1067 mm) heads north along the **Otra river** crossing bridges, dams, tunnels and snow sheds.
- On the tracks, a **steam train from 1894** which takes you right back in time. It is practically impossible to find another period railway in Norway which covers such extraordinary areas.
- Our last stop and arrival station is **Røyknes**.

- During the journey, you can see the **gully** which was used to transport the logs downstream, to the coast, to then be exported.
- As it is a period train, it is not equipped with speakers; no commentary will therefore be provided during the trip.
- In the event that this tour is in great demand, the train route may be subject to change, it may even be completed the other way round from Røyknes to Grovane.
- This excursion is not recommended for wheelchair users.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

HØLLEN, SØGNE AND OPEN-AIR MUSEUM

Description

The environs of Kristiansand are full of surprises and secrets, all to be discovered: ancient churches, picturesque hamlets, museums and coastal landscapes, which are there for the taking.

What we will see

- Coach trip
- Centre of Kristiansand, fortress of Christiansholm, harbour, church of Oddernes
- Vest Agder Open Air Museum, Søgne, church of Søgne, Høllen


What we will do

- We will board our **coach** and immediately head to the **centre of Kristiansand**, in the direction of the various areas to appreciate the city's architecture, with the ancient wood houses, typical of the area and those boasting a more modern design.
- Continuing on, we will discover the **fortress of Christiansholm** surrounded by a splendid park, the **harbour** and the **church of Oddernes**, one of the oldest, dedicated to the Patron Saint, Olaf who introduced Christianity into Norway.
- We will then visit the **Vest Agder Open-Air Museum**, where we will have the opportunity to delve into this region's past with the ancient dwellings and a glimpse into everyday life.
- On the way to **Søgne**, it will then be possible to admire the myriad of small islands which encircle the coast. Once we get to the city, we will visit the **church**, which was recently freshened up according to both a Renaissance and Baroque style, to then

make a final stop in the village of **Høllen** where we will take a stroll.

- We will then return to Kristiansand, where we will be surrounded by an idyllic landscape, a place where many Norwegian families spent their summer holidays.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.
- When one of the churches is being used for religious ceremonies, our tour will be limited to the exterior of the building.

DISCOVERING LILLESAND

Description

Allow ourselves to be carried away with the beauty of the eastern coast of Kristiansand: a boat tour exposing us to a landscape littered with islands, islets and reefs, stopping at the picturesque town of Lillesand.

What we will see






- Boat tour
- Eastern coast of Kristiansand, Blindleia canal, Lillesand

What we will do

- Kristiansand, with approximately 73,000 inhabitants, is the fifth largest city in Norway. Located on the southern coast, it is a favourite holiday destination amongst the Norwegians with its typical towns and picturesque coastline.
- Against this background, on the **eastern coast of Kristiansand** an internal canal has formed, **Blindleia**, which we will cross by **boat** along with three hundred other small vessels, which navigate here protected from the open sea.
- The coastline is characterised by white wood houses, originally built by local fishermen and sailors but which now belong to city dwellers who use them as holiday homes.
- We will head to **Lillesand**, a city with approximately 9 thousand inhabitants, where we will have some free time to explore the small roads brimming with typical shops, restaurants and art exhibitions before returning to Kristiansand.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.
- This tour is not recommended for guests who suffer from sea sickness and those who have mobility problems.

- The itinerary may be subject to change.
- The boat has seats inside and outside; in the event of inclement weather, you are advised to bring a raincoat and wear appropriate clothing.

DISCOVERY OF KRISTIANSAND SURROUNDINGS BY BUS AND STEAMBOAT
Description

Norway is primarily known for its fjords, the stretches of sea which weave into the coast, even across a few kilometres and which are often spectacular. We will be able to discover them on board a picturesque steamboat as part of this excursion which will also allow us to visit the Setesdal Open-Air Museum.

What we will see





- Coach and steamboat trip
- Setesdalen valleys, Bygland fjord, village of Bygland
- Setesdals Museum, guided tour

What we will do

- At the port, we will hop on-board our **coach** in the direction of the **Setesdalen valleys**, following an itinerary amongst nature which will take us to **Bygland fjord**, where we will hop on-board the '**Bjoren**' **steamboat**, enjoying a small cruise in the **fjord** up to the **village of Bygland**.
- SS Bjoren regularly provides trips from the fjord of Byglandsfjord to Bygland-Ose, on the Byglandsfjorden lake in the Setesdal valleys. Using wood as fuel is a natural choice, making the 'Bjoren' a genuine floating museum.
- Surrounded by the majestic mountains which frame the lake, we will continue our journey to the **Setesdals Museum** where a **guided tour** will be provided. It is an open-air museum, which still houses ancient farms, the eldest of which dates back to the 17th Century, and where we can delve into the Norwegian Middle Ages, visiting the large hall of 1650, housed in one of the buildings, whilst centuries-old plants provide a backdrop outside. The museum is located near to Byglandsfjorden lake.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

- The itinerary may be subject to change.
- The coach transfer takes approximately 3 hours.

SIGHTSEEING TOUR OF BERGEN AND SCENIC FUNICULAR RIDE
Description

An exceptional tour on which we discover the main attractions and history of Bergen – once the hub of the Hanseatic League, now a vibrant, commercial centre that retains its traditional maritime air – before turning our attention to the scenic treasures on show in this landscape of fjords and mountains, with an unforgettable ride in the famous Fløibanen funicular.

What we will see





- Håkonshallen, Rosenkrantz Tower and Bryggen Hanseatic Wharf
- Fløibanen Funicular, Mount Fløyen
- Central Park and Lake
- Residential area, wooden houses, gardens, Royal Residence, the wooden Fantoft Stavkirke (stave church)

What we will do

- Our tour begins with passing by **King Haakon's Hall** (Håkonshallen), the imperial residence with adjoining banquet hall built by King Håkon Håkonsson in 1261 and the nearby **Rosenkrantz Tower** (Rosenkrantzårnet), which was built around 1560 by the Governor of Bergen, Erik Rosenkrantz, to serve both as a residence and a fortified tower. Today it even incorporates part of the keep (1273) of King Magnus the Lawmender and Jørgen Hansson's fortress of 1520.
- We will stop on at the picturesque old **wharf district of Bryggen** ('bryggen' in Norwegian means 'wharf'), which was built around 1350 by the Hanseatic League. It is the most picturesque district of Bergen, extending along the eastern side of the port of Vågen, with its long parallel rows of colourful buildings. Once, these buildings were used as offices, homes and stores by the German merchants of the Hanseatic League. Today the Bryggen District is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and boasts shops, restaurants, cafés and artisan workshops. We wander around the alleys between the picturesque warehouses that line the street and along the seafront to enjoy the quaint atmosphere of this neighbourhood.

- We then arrive at the **Fløibanen funicular** station, which has been in operation since 1910. Once aboard, we are transported up the 26% gradient to an altitude of 320 metres a journey of about 8 minutes to reach the summit of **Mount Fløien** (one of the seven mountains that surround Bergen, its name derives from the wind vane placed at the summit many centuries ago to indicate the force and direction of the wind to sailors entering or leaving the port below). Mount Fløien is very popular with the inhabitants of Bergen as a recreation area all year round. From the summit the view is truly impressive: we can see the heart of Bergen at our feet and looking to the west, on a clear day, you can also see the North Sea, and the neighbouring archipelagos.
 - We take the funicular back down, and after boarding the coach, we cross the **Fish Market** square, with its seafood, flowers, fruit and vegetables and souvenir stalls and we head for the **central park** and the **lake**.
 - We then go through the **residential area**, admiring the well-preserved **wooden houses**, the **gardens** and the **Royal Residence** on our way to **Fantoft Stavkirke**. This wooden **stave church**, located in an enchanting wooded area to the south of Bergen, was rebuilt in 1992 after a terrible fire and is the exact replica of the original building which dated back to 1150. In the Middle Ages, in Norway, there were at least 800 of these typical stave churches; today there are only 30 remaining.
 - Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
 - In the event of inclement weather, the view from the platform of the funicular may not be ideal; in these conditions you are also advised to wear appropriate clothing.
- The funicular is very popular among both locals as well as visitors; therefore, long lines at the Funicular should be expected.?

FUNICULAR RIDE AND HIKING ON MOUNT FLØIEN

Description

An unmissable excursion by funicular and on foot to enjoy spectacular views of Bergen and its surroundings from the top of Mount Fløien; breathtaking views that embrace the fjord, the city and the surrounding landscape!

What we will see





- Fløibanen Funicular, Mount Fløien, panoramic view of Bergen
- Hiking on the Fløien Hills, Lake Skomakerdiket, the Blåmansveien hiking trail

- Rundemansvegroad and Rundemanen

What we will do

- We begin our excursion at the **Fløibanen funicular** station, which has been in operation since 1910. Once aboard, we are transported up the 26% gradient to an altitude of 320 metres a journey of about 8 minutes to reach the summit of **Mount Fløien** (one of the seven mountains that surround Bergen, its name derives from the wind vane placed at the summit many centuries ago to indicate the force and direction of the wind to sailors entering or leaving the port below). Both the funicular ride and the belvedere at the top offer a magnificent **panorama of Bergen** and its surroundings.
- After the funicular ride, we begin our **walking tour of the Fløien Hills**, a very popular recreational spot with the inhabitants of Bergen all year round. We walk along one of the many gravel roads, which leads us through woods with gentle hills, until we come to the small, idyllic **Lake Skomakerdiket**; we then take the **main Blåmansveien hiking trail**.
- As we walk uphill, the view becomes increasingly spectacular: we can see the fjord with its many islands, the city of Bergen at our feet and the North Sea in the distance to the west.
- After walking for about 2.5 km, we come to a crossroads. If the weather is favourable, we take the **Rundemansvegroad** and, as we leave the trees behind us, a broad panorama opens before us on all sides. We then come to the highest point, **Rundemanen**, at an altitude of approximately 570 metres, where we stop to rest and enjoy the fresh air.
- Depending on how physically fit you are, and the weather conditions, there is the possibility to extend or shorten the hike. In any case, at the end of the hike we go back down to the city with the funicular.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- This excursion involves walking uphill for about 230 metres, out of a total of 8 km that cover various types of terrain; you are therefore advised to wear trekking or sports shoes and comfortable multi-layered clothing.
- Minors under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- Participants should bring along clothing that is appropriate for the weather conditions, a backpack for personal items and water to stay hydrated along the way.
- To participate in this excursion, you must be physically fit; the tour is not recommended for those who have mobility problems, heart problems or knee problems.
- Depending on where the ship is berthed, the excursion may include transport from the port to the starting point of the tour.

THE SURROUNDINGS OF BERGEN: HISTORY, LOCAL TRADITIONS AND VISIT TO A SALMON FARM

Description

Bergen, the “Fjord capital”, is the starting point for a fantastic panoramic tour among the rural and suburban areas in the Sotra archipelago west of the city. We cannot avoid taking a few photos, stopping at the Øygarden History Museum or enjoying a coffee break with Norwegian specialities in these places suspended between land and sea. We then have the chance of visiting a salmon farm, one of the main activities in the area. The tour is also a special occasion to immerse ourselves in the ancient history of this part of the country without neglecting its extraordinary modernity as reflected in a sophisticated bridge system and important industrial hubs such as the Ågotnes oil centre.

What we will see

- Sightseeing tour of Bergen
- Magnificent views of the old city and of the centre
- Stop for photos and crossing of the Sotra archipelago
- Øygarden, a spectacular chain of islands linked to the mainland by a bridge system
- Stop for photos in Herdlevær
- Visit to the Kystmuseet and to a salmon farm
- Coffee break with delicious *lapper*
- Brief stop for photos at the Solsviksundet bridge and view over the Ågotnes oil centre

What we will do

- Once off the ship, we start our excursion with a short **sightseeing tour of Bergen**, during which we have the opportunity to admire **enchanted views over the old city and the centre**. The second largest city in Norway offers a truly unique spectacle thanks to the colourful façades of the Bryggen district but also showcasing considerable Medieval influences and more modern constructions, especially in the port area.
- We head west to reach the **Sotra archipelago** but not before **stopping for photos** and crossing the majestic Sotra bridge. Sotra is the largest of the islands surrounding Bergen and is inhabited by over 30,000 people.
- We continue our tour passing through the island’s suburban areas and heading north along the coast so as to fully admire the **spectacle that is Øygarden**: the name literally means “row of islands” and it is a true chain of islets linked by a sophisticated bridge system.
- We make an additional **stop for photos in Herdlevær**, a small rural community representative of the most popular activities in the area, i.e. agriculture and fishing, and continue along the short stretch to the **Kystmuseet**, the Øygarden history museum. We watch an interesting clip in the museum and we have the chance to observe a collection of precious artefacts ranging from the Stone Age to the present day.
- The tour ends with a **visit to a salmon farm** and a **delicious coffee break** with **traditional lapper** and sumptuous sour cream

pancakes served with exquisite jam.

- After our tasting session, we make our way back to Bergen stopping briefly for **a few photos on Solsviksundet bridge**: from this privileged panoramic viewpoint, we can take in the typical rural scenery of these places suspended between land and sea in stark contrast to the **modern Ågotnes oil centre**, the maximum expression of modernity as well as the main source of work for the locals.

BERGEN BY MOTORBOAT: A THRILLING TOUR

Description

Norway's second largest city is the departure and arrival point of an extraordinarily unique experience. The possibility of admiring its beauty from a motorboat offers in fact new perspectives and new emotions that are worth the experience. We admire Bergen from the sea first at a "slow pace" near the bustling port of Bergen and then at a faster pace off the coast where the peace of the fjords reigns supreme in an ongoing game of contrasts that contributes to keeping adrenaline levels high. The free time available at the end of the tour is an excellent occasion to discover Bergen by strolling around the city streets and around the picturesque district of Bryggen, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

What we will see



- Thrilling RIB (rigid-inflatable boat) excursion
- Visit of Bergen and of Bryggen district, a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Lively tourist and trading port
- Breathtaking views of the fjords
- High-speed and pure adrenaline
- Free time in the city centre

What we will do

- The first exciting event on this tour is meeting our skilful captain who, after introducing himself, illustrates the characteristics of our rigid-inflatable boat known as **RIB** and gives the necessary safety instructions as well as handing out the special safety equipment. The time has come to set off for a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

- As we sail along the sea in front of Bergen, the captain shows us the city and its port. It is a privileged observation point from where we can appreciate the **wharf area in Bryggen**, a district famous for its colourful wooden façades and declared a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. From here, we can also observe the seven hills surrounding Bergen and the **incessant tourist and trading activities in the port**.
- The wonder at this marvellous view is followed by the thrill of a motorboat ride to the fjords. The scenery gradually changes offering **brehtaking views** of the coastal islets and islands further off the coast linked to the mainland via majestic suspended bridges.
- The tour then transforms into a shot of **pure adrenaline**: the motor roars and the captain makes us experience new emotions as we speed across the sea. The intensity of this experience remains etched in our memory together with the images of the surrounding scenery.
- Our adventure ends as we **return to the city**, where we have some **free time available** to visit the city at leisure.
- The motorboat tour lasts approximately 45 minutes.

An extraordinary panoramic tour of Hardangerfjord, one of the most famous and spectacular fjords in Norway, on which we drive through picturesque villages and mountains overlooking the sea, to discover the true essence of this country and fully appreciate its wild and unspoiled nature.

What we will see






- Bergen: Bergenhus Fortress, Håkonshallen, Rosenkrantz Tower, the Hanseatic wharf district of Bryggen and the Fish Market
- Lake Kaland, the village of Os on the Bjornefjord
- Hatvik, Venjanaset
- Mundheim, Hardangerfjord, the Folgefonna Glacier
- Lunch in the village of Øystese or Norheimsund
- Norheimsund, Steinsdal Waterfall, Tokagjel Gorge and Mount Kvamskogen
- Gullbotn, Soerfjord, the Island of Osterøy
- Northern suburbs of Bergen, Sandviken Bay

What we will do

- We leave Bergen by coach for our excursion, driving past the **Bergenhus Fortress**, the **Håkonshallen** and the **Rosenkrantz Tower**.

- After admiring the buildings of the old **Bryggen Hanseatic Wharf** and the **Fish Market** , we proceed to **Os** , a village on the **Bjornefjord** , 30 km south of the city.
- From here we begin a brief panoramic tour of the fjord, during which we are stunned by the spectacular view of the islands and the snow-capped mountains. We then reach **Hatvik** , where we take the ferry to cross the fjord to **Venjanaset** , on the opposite side.
- Our journey then leads us through small villages set in typical, west-coast scenery as we proceed to **Mundheim** and the **Hardangerfjord** , one of the most well-known Norwegian fjords, which lies framed by mountains reflected in the clear water and is famous for its many orchards.
- Our panoramic coach tour continues with a spectacular view of the mountains on the opposite side of the fjord. Weather permitting, we can even see the **Folgefonna Glacier** the third largest in Norway which covers an area of 203 square kilometres.
- We reach the **village of Øystese** , which sits in the bay of the fjord against a backdrop of high mountains, surrounded by green farms. We stop here for **lunch** , before returning to the **village of Norheimsund** , where we head inland to the **Steinsdal Waterfall** which has a sheer drop of 50 metres where we can cross the valley without getting wet.
- After going through many tunnels, we come to the **Tokagjel Gorge** and the **Kvamskogen Mountain Plateau** , a favoured dining and picnic spot among the inhabitants of Bergen. Indeed, there are numerous wooden chalets here and the area is ideal for hiking in summer and skiing during the winter and spring.
- We then go down along the fjord again, before going up to **Gullbotn** , where there is a closer recreational area with ski pistes and ski jumps.
- From here we go down to the **Soerfjord**. Across the water, on the opposite side of the fjord lies **Osterøy** , the largest island on the western coast.
- Our tour proceeds towards the **northern suburbs of Bergen** and before returning to the port we have the opportunity to admire the typical architecture of **Sandviken Bay**.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- This excursion is purely scenic and involves long stretches travelling by coach on winding roads (about 6 hours).

PANORAMIC TOUR IN BERGEN AND EDVARD GRIEG'S HOUSE

Description

An exceptional tour through Bergen, to admire the old quarter Hanseatic Bryggen, where you can still feel the atmosphere of the past of trade and seafaring traditions, and the house of the famous composer Edvard Grieg, another famous attraction of this beautiful city.


What we will see

- King Haakon's Hall, Rosenkrantz Tower, Bryggen Quarter
- Suburbs of Bergen
- Troidhaugen (E. Grieg house) and "Troldsalen" Concert Hall with the opportunity to listen to some tracks.

What we will do

- We will leave the port and we will start our tour passing in front of the King Haakon's Hall (Håkonshallen), the imperial residence with adjoining banquet hall built by King Håkon Håkonsson between 1247 and 1261 for the wedding and the coronation of his son Magnus Lagabøter . The Håkonshallen is considered the largest medieval secular building existing in Norway today.
- Next to Håkonshallen, we will find the Rosenkrantz Tower (Rosenkrantztårnet), built around 1560 by the governor of Bergen Erik Rosenkrantz, with the function of a residence and that of a fortification. Today it also incorporates part of King Magnus Male (1273) the Legislature and the fortress of 1520 of Jørgen Hansson. Several spiral staircases, corridors and the guard posts, lead to the top, where you can enjoy a beautiful view of the harbor.
- In the vicinity we can also admire the buildings of the old Bryggen (whose name means 'shore'), built around 1350 by the Hanseatic League. It is the most picturesque district of Bergen and it stretches on the east bank of the port of Vågen, with long parallel rows of colorful buildings (often pendants) from the sloping roof, built with rough wooden planks and wooden foundations or piled stones.
- Once these buildings served as commercial offices, homes and warehouses and housed the German merchants of the Hanseatic League that had the monopoly of trade with Norway. Today, Bryggen is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is home to shops, restaurants, cafes and artisan shops.
- We will then we move to the suburbs of Bergen, surrounded by mountains and where the old houses with gardens are still in excellent condition.
- After a short walk in the open air, we will arrive to Troidhaugen (whose name means 'hill of the trolls'), located on the shores of Lake Nordås ,it is famous because it is the house, now a museum, of the famous Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg, who he lived here for 22 years and where he composed many of his most famous works.
- In Troidhaugen we will visit the 'Troldsalen', a hall for chamber music concerts inaugurated in 1985 ,that can accommodate up to 200 people, here we will have the opportunity to listen to some songs of Edvard Grieg played by a Norwegian pianist.
- Immediately after the concert, we will visit the famous artist's house, before returning back to the ship.

TOUR OF STAVANGER AND SURROUNDINGS

Sample the history of the city of Stavanger, for centuries one of the cornerstones of Norwegian maritime history: from a time when Viking kings fought battles on the Hafstrfjord to modern-day tankers, not forgetting the age of 'white sails' and steam ships. Don't miss this opportunity to visit the city and discover its many faces.


What we will see

- Ullandhaug
- Jæren landscape
- Ryfylke Mountains
- Sverd i fjell (the 'Swords in Rock')
- Stavanger Cathedral
- Old Stavanger

What we will do

- We will set off from the port by coach through the lush agricultural landscape to **Ullandhaug**, an area famous for its reconstructions of Iron Age farms. Ullandhaug also boasts breath-taking views of the **Hafstrfjord** where, in 872, the Viking king Harald Fairhair defeated the last of the local princes and unified 29 small kingdoms under one crown, founding the Kingdom of Norway. To the east stretches the fertile **landscape of Jæren**, with the **Ryfylke Mountains** in the distance.
- We will then continue to the outskirts of Stavanger to admire the **Sverd i fjell ('Swords in Rock')**, a fascinating memorial by the sculptor Fritz Røed. The monument depicts three 10 metre-high swords that commemorate the historic battle of Hafstrfjord. The largest sword represents the victorious Harald, while the smaller ones symbolise the vanquished kings. The monument is also intended to symbolise peace, as the swords are struck in solid rock, from which they can never be removed.
- We will now pass through both the older and more modern districts of Stavanger; we will admire the inside of the **Cathedral**, built in around 1125 by Bishop Reinald of Winchester with the help of British craftsmen. Of all the churches built in Norway during the Middle Ages, Stavanger Cathedral is the only one that still retains its original features.
- Before returning to the ship, we will treat ourselves to a walk through 'Old Stavanger', with its typical narrow streets lined with picturesque wooden houses that date back to the 18th and 19th centuries, a time when it was home to sailors, craftsmen and merchants. This unique area, located just a few minutes from the port, is now at the centre of the city's most ambitious redevelopment project.
- Places on this excursion are limited. We recommend booking early.
- During religious functions the visit to the cathedral will only be a tour of the exterior.

- Our adventure begins in **Stavanger**. The heart of the Norwegian oil industry, it is the country's fourth largest city in terms of population and is located at the entrance to the Gandsfjord, sheltered from the North Sea. The city has a fascinating architectural heritage that combines tradition and modernity, with numerous picturesque wooden houses that were once home to seafarers and craftsmen overlooking the port.
- We will arrive at the heliport after a short coach journey and take off for the **Lysefjord**, which stretches inland for approximately 50 kilometres. This fjord is considered the wildest because it is surrounded by rugged **mountain peaks and glaciers**. Only in small pockets is there enough space for small isolated farms, surrounded by breath-taking landscapes.
- We will arrive at the **Preikestolen (the 'pulpit' rock)**, a flat rock that overlooks the Lysefjord from a height of 604 metres. It is a very popular tourist attraction that boasts wonderful views of the surrounding landscapes.

VISIT TO TJOLÖHOLM CASTLE

Description
What we will see

- Fjärås Bräcka glacial formation, Iron Age cemetery with ancient gravestones
- Elizabethan Tjolöholm castle: Tudor façade and Art Nouveau interiors
- Free time to visit the garden and exterior

- We start our tour by reaching **Fjärås Bräcka**, a 4 km-long ridge formed as the ice retreated between 12,000 and 13,000 years ago and now one of the country's most impressive and important **glacial formations**.
- Fjärås Bräcka is famous for its **Iron Age cemetery** located on the edge of its ridge featuring **hundreds of ancient gravestones**. From here we can also admire amazing views of the surrounding scenery.

- Our itinerary continues to a magnificent peninsula in the Kungsbacka fjord, location of the marvellous **Tjolöholm castle**, built between 1898 and 1904 by James Fredrik and Blanche Dickson in a perfect **Elizabethan style** on a design by the architect Lars Israel Wahlman. Before entering the castle, our guide provides us with some general information on the building and its fascinating architecture.
- While the **façade** presents typical 16th-century and **Tudor** elements, the **interior** is a splendid example of **Art Nouveau** and William Morris style.
- Despite the many fireplaces, the building is heated by a hot air pipe system. The three bathrooms were, at the time, equipped with showers and sunken bathtubs and the property had its own power generator, making the project very modern.
- After visiting the interior of the castle and before returning to the ship, we have some **free time** available to explore and admire the **amazing garden and exterior**.

- We cross this enchanting city along **Västra Gatan**, a characteristic road flanked by **typical colourful wooden houses** and listen to the narration illustrating the history of these places, of their kings and various battles.
- The itinerary then continues north-west towards the North Sea. A short coach transfer takes us across the **Tjörnbron bridge** connecting the **island of Tjörn** with the mainland and where many **fishing communities** live.

- The first stop on our tour takes us to the picturesque **fishing village of Klädesholmen**, famous all over Sweden for its **herring production** which started off stored in containers and small barrels towards the end of the 1800s.
- Nowadays, almost half of the pickled herrings in Sweden comes from Klädesholmen, where there is also a small herring museum. The village is made up of two small islands and it is a truly enchanting place with its wooden red and white painted houses, a harbour and many fishing boats.
- We continue across this lovely island as far as another characteristic **fishing village** nestled among the rocks and directly overlooking the North Sea: **Skärhamn**. With its 3000 inhabitants, it is the main settlement on the island. The walk along the pier towards the commercial harbour is truly wonderful.
- The village of Skärhamn is also famous for its **Nordic Watercolour Museum** which is built on stilts among the rocks smoothed by the water and characterised by large windows overlooking the surrounding sea. Inside, the permanent collection and temporary exhibitions are dedicated to international watercolour artists and it also features a research and teaching centre for watercolour techniques.
- At the end of the visit, we return to Göteborg and the ship.

What we will see

- We leave the port behind us and start our tour north as far as the **city of Arvidsvik**, located approximately 40 km from Göteborg and where we board a **ferry** that in just a few minutes takes us to the **island of Marstrand**.
- Marstrand was already known in the past as an important trading centre and the base for the Swedish fleet and can now be

defined as a summer holiday paradise due to its **numerous beaches, natural landscapes, restaurants and cafés, small shops and the Strandverket contemporary art gallery**. But the island still shows traces of its ancient times, such as some caves dating back to the Stone Age.

- During our visit, we go for a **stroll along the picturesque alleyways** to admire the **typical wooden houses** and various sights such as the 19th-century building where King Oscar II used to throw luxurious parties.
- We then head to the higher part of the island with the imposing **Carlstens fortress**, built on the request of Charles X Gustav of Sweden after the Treaty of Roskilde concluded in 1658 that handed back the Bohuslän region, and therefore also the island of Marstrand (previously under Danish-Norwegian rule) to Sweden. Over the centuries, the castle was taken twice, but it was always handed back to the heirs of Charles X through long negotiations and peace treaties.
- We then visit the fortress and admire its **massive walls, bastions and towers** offering amazing views of the coast and archipelago islands as well as on the hundreds of boats taking part in numerous international sailing and racing events.
- After visiting the fortress, we return to the ship.

- We begin our sightseeing tour of Göteborg by admiring its most famous sights such as the **Opera House**, a majestic Post-Modern building overlooking the water, the **Chalmers University of Technology** with its 13 departments founded in 1829 by William Chalmers, director of the Swedish East India Company, the **Gustav Adolf square**, hub of the public life, seat of the Town Hall and named after the 17th-century Swedish king and great leader who founded Göteborg, and the **Avenyn boulevard**, the shopping street brimming with life and boasting many pubs, restaurants and fashionable shops and filled with street artists entertaining the tourists as well as the locals.
- Our guide also shows us other more hidden sights but just as interesting and true symbols of the city.
- Among them, we see the **Feskekörka**, whose name in Swedish means “fish church” and which derives from the fact that the building looks like a Gothic Revival church. It is in fact an **indoor fish market** overlooking the canal and looks just like a church. It also features many **restaurants and delis** where we can savour the typical products of the western coast (lobsters, prawns, oysters and shrimp).
- We continue our itinerary by admiring the **granite fountain** by Tore Strindberg located in the centre of **Järntorget square** inside a square pedestal. It features **5 female sculptures representing the five Continents**.
- The next stop takes us to the **Skansen Kronan fortress**, surrounded by 23 cannons and built during the second half of the 17th century with a defensive function against the Danish attack from the south. The fortress is now a private facility used for congresses as well as for events and weddings.
- After visiting the fortress, we **stop briefly for photos** near the **Röda Sten art gallery** (meaning “red stone” in Swedish), a famous centre for contemporary art located in an old industrial district under the Älvsborg bridge. Its name derives from the nearby red varnished stones and the gallery is divided into four levels hosting temporary exhibitions and events.
- We then reach the famous **Götaplatsen**, inaugurated in 1923 on the occasion of an international fair to celebrate the 300th anniversary of the founding of the city. At the centre of the square, which is the city's cultural hub, we admire the majestic **bronze statue of Poseidon** by Carl Milles.
- We then have some **free time for lunch** and to discover the wide range of **products local shops** have to offer.
- One last stop awaits us after our lunch and shopping break and before returning to the ship: a stroll in the company of our guide around the **Haga district**, renowned for its **picturesque houses made partly of brick and partly of wood, its 19th-century atmosphere and its many cafés**. It was born as a suburb inhabited by the working class but it evolved over the years to become one of the most popular destinations with both tourists and locals, especially after many buildings were refurbished or rebuilt during the 1980s.

- The itinerary continues with an interesting visit to **Masthuggskyrkan**, a **church** built in 1914 in the Swedish Romantic style and one of the city's symbols as well as a popular tourist attractions thanks to its incredible vantage point.
- After visiting the church, we continue towards the **Haga district**, renowned for its **picturesque wooden houses, its 19th-century atmosphere and its many cafés**.
